Did you know: Leontyne Price, a Black diva, made her operatic debut with the Metropolitan Opera in 1961; in 1938 the first Black woman was elected to a state legislature; in 1926 Violette Nealy Anderson became the first Black woman to argue before the Supreme Court; Toni Morrison, Nobel Award winning author, was born on February 18, 1931; in 1988 Debi Thomas became the first African American to win a medal at the Winter Olympics; and Rosa Parks, civil rights activist, was born on February 4, 1913.

The Program committee has asked club members to wear some type of African dress or accessories to the club meeting in recognition and support of our sisters who are still struggling against old customs, ancient tribal laws, poor education, child marriages, female genital mutilation, domestic violence and unequal rights/opportunities.

Meeting Minutes for January 27, 2016



President Donna Kahl-Wilkerson convened the meeting and gave the blessing.

Area 2 Director Lori Hanewold presented an informative overview of Zonta Club, District, and International goals and accomplishments for 2015. She shared results from the Zonta International Member Satisfaction Survey and praised the Zonta Club of Milwaukee for meeting the goals of advocacy, service, mission, fellowship and PR. Hanewold mentioned our Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence Walk, the local coverage bringing Zonta into the news, and our activities with Neu-Life in working with the students to become aware of and understand the issues of human trafficking, including bringing a wider awareness to the community through their collaborative art.

Hanewold encouraged Zontians to explore the wider venue of Zonta by attending conferences to gather with other women from different clubs and check out the International accomplishments, as well as to become fully involved in the various activities.

The goal of increasing membership – a district-wide goal of a 5% increase (2 people per club per year) – is one that Zonta Club of Milwaukee was quite successful in meeting, and exceeding. Pam Knackert informed us that we received 18 new members and although we lost 5 members, it was an increase of 13.

Many upcoming events were mentioned such as the Zonta Club of Milwaukee Fashion Show, the Area 2 Spring Workshop, Advocacy Training, International Women's Day, Madison's Zonta Zing, the Janesville International Luncheon, Beloit's Tribute to Women, and the Fall Conference, October 7–9, which will be workshop oriented as it is not an election year. Also, the International Convention in France, for which the early registration deadline is coming up February 27, 2016, would be a wonderful event to attend. Thank you from all of us to Lori Hanewold for all her hard work as Area 2 Director.

President Donna Kahl-Wilkerson offered the Agenda for approval. It was moved by Donna Neal and seconded by Marge Holzbog. The members approved the agenda.

Committee Reports:

Correspondence: (none)

Finance: Diane Lindsley reported the club's assets and related information that our CD would be changed in February from PNC Bank to Landmark, where it will have an interest rate of 1.35% for 19 months.*

Service: Donna Neal reported that we served 70 children with our holiday gifts. This number has increased since last year by about 20 children. The children were delighted and made thank-you pins for us.

The Neu-Life ARTREACH program at the high school level will begin working on their individual artistic statements and then look for the synergy among them to work on collaborative art pieces. Zonta Club of Milwaukee had good news coverage from FOX News on the display at City Hall of the Neu-Life collaborative art, bringing stronger awareness to the community about the issue of human trafficking. The coverage has given Jody Rhodes opportunities to share the vision for Neu-Life and the ARTREACH program. This has been very well received and there is interest in highlighting this for a broader community response and involvement.

This ARTREACH program was modeled after the Zonta program in Saratoga, Florida, so it is very exciting to have this interest expanding.

Representatives from 40 organizations are attending an event January 28, 2016, at 88.9 Radio Milwaukee in recognition of Human Trafficking Awareness Month, and Jody Rhodes will again be speaking about the ARTREACH program. On February 5, 2016, the Racine Coalition Against Human Trafficking will have the student artwork on display.

It was approved to have the student work on display for the Zonta Area Workshop.

Membership: Pam Knackert shared that Verona Swanigan was not able to attend the meeting, so her installation as new member will hopefully be in February. We have 18 new members and we have lost 5 members during this biennium (2014-2016). There will be another prospective membership meeting after the Fashion Show in April. It is thought that our mentor program is an excellent way to get and keep new members involved, as is inviting new members to become part of a committee as soon as possible.

Advocacy: None

PR: (Joni Reese) Thank you to Krista Betts for doing a wonderful January newsletter! Thank you to Joni Reese for all her efforts and expertise in transforming our website, and to her and Diane Lindsley for updating our club history. By this printing, we will be accessing the new website from the same Zonta Club of Milwaukee URL (www.zontamilwaukee.org) that we have used in the past.

Program: Barbara Wyatt Sibley reminded us that February is Black History Month. Celia Jackson of Alverno College will present a reflection on a speech by Martin Luther King, Jr., called "Remaining Awake Through a Great Revolution" and how it relates to today. If members have African attire, they are encouraged to wear it to the meeting.

In March we invite any member to wear green in celebration of Saint Patrick's Day. Elaine Maly, Vice President of Development and Operations for TimeSlips, will be our speaker and share with us how creative storytelling is used as a way to help people with dementia. April is our annual meeting so there will be no speaker. We will have our May meeting at the Sojourner Truth Family Peace Center, which will include a tour of their new facility.

Scholarship/Foundation: Missy Creevy reported that the Foundation Board has solicited, received and awarded the grants for 2015 dollars – \$15,000 to be distributed at the Fashion Show in April. There were 31 applicants, an increase over past years. The grants will go to the following programs, selected for their alignment with the goals and mission of Zonta:

- Neu-Life Community Resource Center for their Youth Non-violence Program
- Core/El Centro for their Traumatic & Healing Program
- My Home/Your Home for their Lissy's Place independent living program
- Our Next Generation for their Phenomenal Ladies Program
- The Women's Center of Waukesha for their Empowerment Program

Fashion Show: Pam Knackert distributed the invitations for the Fashion Show, April 9, 2016, which promises to be a wonderful time. The program is a piece of art in itself. Members are encouraged to bring a bottle of wine to donate for the wine pull. Seventy-five lovely reusable bags have been donated by Debra Koller, which will make the occasion festive. Baskets for the raffle are welcome, as are donations for the silent auction. Donna Neal will send a reference to fundraising information called "Circle of Influence," which is a great way to think about approaching people to become involved.

Old Business:

Announcement: Circle of Women, a program of the YWCA, is the largest fundraiser luncheon in Milwaukee. There is a \$100-125 minimum donation. The date is April 27, 2016, at the Potawatomi Hotel.

Special Projects: President Donna Kahl-Wilkerson reminded us that our February mini project is to donate new or gently used water bottles for the young people at Neu-Life. Clothes for the Dress for Success for Less project at Alverno College were collected. Joni Reese will be making a list of mini projects with which applicants for the scholarships are interested in getting help.

Area Workshop: A subcommittee is needed for the Area Workshop, which will be April 23, 2016, at the MRA offices. This subcommittee will organize registration, publicity, set-up, etc., as needed. Elizabeth Stull will gather the subcommittee. We are reminded that this is a club effort. The Area directors need to meet by March 15, 2016, and the subcommittee will meet after that to finalize the plans by April 15, 2016.

New Business:

Nominating Committee: Helen Ludwig alerted us that half the Club Board and half the Foundation Board are due for elections in April, to be installed in May.

Pam Knackert offered to collect from anyone the \$30 for the Madison Zonta Zing Fundraiser, March 5, 2016, to send in with her own reservation. Carpooling is available, so please consider attending the event. It has been fun in the past.


