Happy summer, everyone!



non-profit organization at the age of 7: Girlz in Action (www.girlzinaction.com) which focuses on younger girls (ages 7-12) and teaches manners, self-esteem communication and social skills. Erica was also invited to the White House in 2016 as a Champion of Change in building bridges between youth and law enforcement. Locally, Erica is a United Way representative, a motivational speaker and numerous other activities.

The applications for the JMK Women in Business and the Women in STEM scholarships are due by June 15, 2017.

**Finance:** As of the end of April we had \$15,499.31 in the checkbook and a CD worth \$5646.46. Thirty-seven members have paid their dues.

**Advocacy:** Safe Harbor Legislation – Cards that we made out at a previous meeting to send to our state representatives made a difference. Seventeen state senators are on board with this bill. In addition, US House bill 1625 has been entered and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations. It is cited as the "Targeted Rewards for the Global Eradication of Human Trafficking", or the "TARGET Act".

**Board Installations:** New Club Board Directors Marge Holzbog, Janet Kloser and Regina Young-Ferguson were installed. Retiring Board Members Donna Neal, Deb Koller and Laurie Ward were thanked for their service.

New Foundation Board Members Elizabeth Stull, Sandra Goldmann and Gloria Jones were installed. Retiring Board Members Jackie Beaudry, Lori Peterson and Susan Koepsell (deceased) were thanked for their service.

**Forward Committee:** Montez Ashley discussed the results of the tabletop exercises done in March. There is full agreement within the Club to continue with ARTREACH. The Club will also continue with backpacks and the career fair for Neu-Life. We will concentrate on Mentoring Others, Social Justice, and Race Relations and Justice. Other Forward Committee members are Barbara Wyatt Sibley, Donna Conant and Donna Neal.

**Service:** There will be a fundraiser for Neu-Life at Rock Bottom Restaurant on June 1. Tickets are \$5 each. Please keep your eyes open for venues for ARTREACH presentations to the public. A Location Committee has been developed to identify such locations.

Club members were requested to bring items for donation to Lad Lake (whose chief program officers was the speaker in March). If anyone wants to take a tour of their Dousman facility on a weekend, let Joni Reese know. Montez Ashley, Pam Knackert, Lynne Oehlke, Gloria Jones, Donna Neal and Lori Peterson expressed interest.

**Advocacy:** The Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women annual walk will likely be Monday, September 25. Email Krista to be on the planning committee. Donna Neal expressed the need to increase the number of marchers. First year (2015) we had 75 people; in 2016 we had 40 and we want more than 100 marchers for 2017.

**Membership:** There was a presentation for potential members on May 3.

**Program:** We are looking for a new location. Many of the suggestions will not work unless we raise our prices. We try to keep the meal below \$19.50 so with tax and tip it stays around \$25. We need to cover meals for guests and gifts for speakers.

**Public Relations:** Elizabeth Stull now heads up this committee. Joni Reese will continue to focus on the website and social media. She will post the club Annual Report on the website with updates. Krista Betts arranges and publishes the newsletter.

#### **Membership Committee**

Increasing club membership remains a focus. Our June gathering provides another opportunity to invite friends and co-workers to come out and get to know ZONTA.


**United Nations:** No report.
