

Meeting Minutes for February 24, 2016



Christine Todd gave the blessing.

We welcomed guest **Amrie Debatin**, originally from Germany, now living in Pewaukee, and hope she will become a member of the Zonta Club of Milwaukee.

Our planned speaker was taken ill and unable to present at the meeting, so we were privileged to be part of an insightful, moving opening address about the importance of celebrating Black History Month, given by **Barbara Wyatt Sibley**. We were each asked, "What am I personally going to do to make Race Relations improve in Milwaukee?" This is a difficult and important question. We heard heartfelt answers from various members of the club. Thank you to Barbara and those who shared for helping us to think more broadly, to pursue more personal relationships across race and cultural lines, to increase our understanding of one another, and to improve the broader issue of race relations.

Diane Lindsley presented information on the Human Trafficking Task Force of Greater Milwaukee legislative advocacy subcommittee, which is encouraging support of the Safe Harbor legislation. Postcards to the Wisconsin governor, senator, attorney generals and representatives were available for those who wanted to offer support to passing this Safe Harbor legislation. The legislation will educate the public as well as law enforcement and provide financial support for coordinated services in our communities to help eradicate human trafficking in Wisconsin.

Pam Knackert presided over the installation of Verona Swanigan. We are happy to welcome her to the Zonta Club of Milwaukee. She is our 54th member!

President Donna Kahl-Wilkerson convened the meeting.

Donna Kahl-Wilkerson reminded us that March 8 is Zonta International Rose Day. Members are invited to donate to the Rose Fund in honor of women who have inspired them.

The January minutes were accepted.

Committee Reports:

Correspondence (Judith Lehman): None at this time.

Finance (Diane Lindsley): The books tie out and the process to get the appropriate IRS papers for the proof of address of the Club is underway. The CD will be redeposited at PNC Bank until the IRS documentation is complete.

Service (Donna Neal): The ARTREACH program has three new paintings sketched out and will be working to complete these. Thank you for the wine already donated for the silent auction; we will be looking for additional bottles at the March meeting. The date has been set for the 2017 Fashion Show: April 1, 2017.

Z Club (Joann Comodore, Victoria Frazier): The names of the high school girls will be sent to Zonta International Headquarters in the upcoming months. The plan is to work with the girls a little longer to solidify their interest and understanding of the Zonta organization, so there will be less movement in and out of the group as the year unfolds.

Fashion Show Update





Construction Update

The elevator has been installed, and a new main entrance (off the parking lot) is under construction and slated to be in use by March 19. Lower level rooms are in various stages of renovation. On the upper floor, the new bathrooms have been operating for several months, the two main rooms have been painted, and new flooring is being installed, first in the large main room with the stage. The entire project should be done by June.

ARTREACH

Three paintings are in progress in the ARTREACH program for high school youth at the main site. Demand is increasing for displaying the eight paintings from prior classes. After being displayed at Milwaukee City Hall during the 16 Days of Advocacy, the art was displayed at the Human Trafficking Task Force of Greater Milwaukee event for Human Trafficking Awareness Month at the end of January, at a Racine Human Trafficking Task Force fundraiser, and at a neighborhood youth program event (the youth themselves presented the program at this event) in February. Upcoming displays/information sharing include:

- Thursday, March 10: Jody Rhodes will be giving a presentation on the ARTREACH program to a Concordia University class.
- **Wednesday, March 16:** The paintings will be on display at the MANDI Art Walk. The Milwaukee Awards for Neighborhood Development Innovation recognize individuals, organizations, and programs that enrich central city neighborhoods. It is an annual event with an expected 800 attendees.
- Thursday, March 17: Jody will present ARTREACH to the United Way of Greater Milwaukee.

We will be convening a task force after spring break to formulate plans about the expansion of the ARTREACH program – both community displays of the paintings/program and expansion of the program beyond Neu-Life. **Mary Staten** and **Donna Neal** will join Jody Rhodes, Tracy Hranoja, and Devonte Bonds from Neu-Life in this brainstorming and planning process. We are certainly open to participation from other Zontians, so contact Donna if you'd like to be involved. This is one effort where Service and Advocacy come together for the Zonta Club of Milwaukee.

March Mini Service Project

We will be accepting donations of new or gently used cookbooks for HeartLove Place.

HeartLove Place fills a major gap in central Milwaukee by offering the ProStart Culinary Arts Program, which trains and prepares participants to obtain entry-level careers in the food service and hospitality industry. This is a 14-week program founded by the National Restaurant Association Educational Foundation. Since its inception at HeartLove Place in 2002, ProStart has graduated over 500 people from the program and has helped place 46% in industry-related jobs. Other graduates have gone on to open their own companies, advance their education further, and take positions in other industries.


Meet Our Members
