Greetings, Milwaukee Zontians!

April was a busy month. We started off with one of our biggest fundraisers in some time! Almost 300 guests attended our annual Fashion Show! Goodwill Industries of Southeastern Wisconsin provided an excellent review of fashions over the years in celebration of our club's 90 years of service to women in our community. Because of the interest in our club generated by the fundraiser, the Membership Committee held an information session on May 4. It was well attended, so look for our membership to increase!

Next, we hosted a smashingly successful Area Workshop. The topic was "Telling Your Story" and Sister Patricia Rogers, of Milwaukee's Dominican Center for Women, was mesmerizing. She spoke of personal experiences during the 1960s integration efforts in the South. Our own Cheryl Lucas-DeBerry shared some experiences as well. There's much to say about the workshop, so be sure to read about it in our Annual Report as well.

At April's Annual Meeting, the Club voted for and installed the 2016–2017 officers and directors of our Club Board. The officers are Helen Ludwig, President; Maria Bellmann, President-Elect; Joann Comodore, Vice President; Karen Smith, Secretary; and Diane Lindsley, Treasurer. The new Directors are Krista Betts, Joyce McCrary, La Toya Sykes, Debra Koller, and Donna Neal; Laureen Ward is also continuing as a Club Director. As President, I want to say a special thank-you to outgoing Directors Barbara Fitzgerald and Elizabeth Stull for their service. We also voted on the recommendation of Zonta International Convention delegates from the Board: Helen Ludwig and Joni Reese as voting delegates; Jackie Beaudry and La Toya Sykes as alternates.

Our April mini project was donating sets of twin sheets to CORE/El Centro for its massage therapy program. We collected approximately 25 sets. Thank you!

We also learned that Neu-Life was nominated for Program/Agency of the Year by the Wisconsin Association of Child and Youth Care Professionals (WACYCP), and Donna Neal was nominated for Youth Work Volunteer of the Year. The awards were presented at the WACYCP 16th Annual Youth Work Awards Celebration, and both Neu-Life and Donna won. Congratulations to both!

Meeting Minutes for April 27, 2016



Zonta Club of Milwaukee Annual Meeting Minutes

The evening blessing was given by Joyce McCrary.

President Donna Kahl-Wilkerson shared a bit of history about Denim Day, which was started in Italy as a statement about rape and sexual assault.

The agenda was presented for review and approved.

Acceptance of the minutes from the March Meeting were moved by Lynne Oehlke and seconded by Gloria Jones. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Judy Lehman read two thank-you letters: the first from TimeSlips, thanking Zonta for our donation, and the second from HeartLove Place, thanking us for the donation of 50 cookbooks.

Finance Committee: Diane Lindsley reported that the Club has a balance of \$17,061.43, which is higher because of the collection of dues. To date, 33 of 54 people have paid their dues. We took in 18 new members and lost 3 members; 2 members were gained at the half year. \$5 from each member meal is kept in reserves and used to fund guest meals. Diane Lindsley and Barbara Fitzgerald have reviewed the budget and everything ties out. Diane Lindsley suggested, Donna Conant moved, and Susan Koepsell seconded that the financial books be checked by an auditor to make certain we are using best practices. Motion carried.

Service Committee: Donna Neal presented information about the Neu-Life Art Show, May 14, 2016, at the Neu-Life building. Tickets are \$25 and include lunch provided by Neu-Life youth and local eateries. The students' artwork will be available for sale and auction.

Donna Neal is one of the possible recipients of the Wisconsin Association of Child and Youth Care Professionals (WACYCP) awards, for Youth Work Volunteer of the Year. Neu-Life is nominated for Program/Agency of the Year. Both Neu-Life and Donna are competing against one other nominee. The winners will be announced at the WACYCP awards dinner Thursday, May 5, 2016, at the Milwaukee Downtown Doubletree.

Other Neu-Life staff have been nominated for Youth Care Worker of the Year (in the categories of Working with Youth Aged 6-12 and Working with Youth Aged 13-18), Youth Work Supervisor of the Year, and the Dedication Award.

An ad hoc **Service Research Committee**, headed by Jackie Beaudry and Donna Kahl-Wilkerson, will evaluate opportunities for the Zonta Club of Milwaukee's future service projects. The group could use two more members to join in the effort.

Membership Committee: Pam Knackert reported that 13 people who learned about Zonta from this year's Fashion Show are interested in Zonta. There will be a reception May 4, 2016, with 8 of the 13 expected to attend. It was also suggested to invite these potential members to the May 25, 2016, Club Meeting at the Sojourner Family Peace Center.



Program Committee: Barbara Wyatt Sibley reminded us that the next meeting will be at the new Sojourner Family Peace Center facility at 6th and Walnut in Milwaukee. We will have a tour and a meal. There is off-street as well as street parking.

Scholarship: Missy Creevy noted that Zonta International emphasizes gender equality in education so that the playing field for advancement is more level. The three scholarships presented by the Zonta Club of Milwaukee are the Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship, for which completed applications are due June 15, 2016; the Young Women in Public Affairs Award, for which our winner, Abby Thompson, has also received the District level award; and the Women in STEM Scholarship, for which applications are due June 15, 2016. We also will put forth effort in finding candidates for the Amelia Earhart Fellowship from Zonta International.

Advocacy Committee: Karen Hunt suggested members attend the documentary *The Abolitionists*, offered at many area theaters on May 16, 2016, at 7:30 pm. The documentary addresses human trafficking and will hopefully create widespread awareness. Karen offered to coordinate information so that Zonta members might connect at the theaters to share the evening.

The Second Annual Silent Walk will be held the last Monday in September. It was highly successful last year in bringing awareness to the issue of domestic violence.

Fashion Show: Lynne Oehlke reported that the Zonta Club of Milwaukee raised \$23,399.89 from the Fashion Show this year. Information was collected on the strengths and weaknesses of the event, and any issues will be worked on to enhance already working procedures or improve procedures for next year. We had 291 paid dinners; 276 people attended.

Public Relations: Joni Reese ensured that a picture was taken of the Club members with the sheets that were purchased for donation to CORE/El Centro. Members were asked to update their profiles on the website.

Z Club: Victoria Frazier shared that there is a meeting scheduled with the principal of Milwaukee High School of the Arts. The committee is working on getting commitments from the young women to be members in good standing.

Spring Area Workshop: Cheryl Lucas-DeBerry reported that the event was successful. Sister Patricia Rogers of the Dominican Center for Women, who spoke of her experience in the integration of a high school in Arkansas, was greatly appreciated.

Support for Sister Clubs: Connie Thoma reported that the Milwaukee ornament was sent to the Zonta Club of Maryland for its celebration/auction.

Announcements: Donna Kahl-Wilkerson shared that there is a breakfast, Friday, April 29, 2016 planned by the Muslim Community, if one or two of us would like to attend. We share a vision of equality with this group.

Also, we will send a letter/email of congratulations to the Neu-Life staff for their tireless efforts working with Milwaukee's youth.

Our June meeting will be at the Northwest Family Center, as we enjoyed using their space for our winter holiday party. The date will be June 22, 2016. Barbara Wyatt Sibley, Program Chair, will plan the fun event.

Foundation

Missy Creevy reported that we had an increase of applicants for the grants, due to strong publicity of the opportunity. Each year the Zonta Club of Milwaukee Foundation uses two thirds of the money raised for local projects and forwards one third to the Zonta International Foundation.

The money for Zonta International Foundation is to be allocated as follows:

- 15% Amelia Earhart Fellowship
- 10% Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship
- 0% Women in Public Affairs Award
- 50% International Service Fund
- 25% ZISVAW
- 0% Rose Fund

Foundation Treasurer Pam Knackert reported that for the 2015 calendar year the Zonta Club of Milwaukee Foundation had ended with \$137,000, after cashing the certificate of deposit. In 2015 our investments declined slightly, but we had donations. We gave \$15,000 to agencies for the 2016 scholarships and have \$1,600 for the Neu-Life backpack effort.



Advocacy



Human Trafficking Updates

In early April, Governor Walker signed SB 323, which gives the right to an advocate during a case to victims of sexual assault, human trafficking and child sexual abuse. Later in April, he signed SB 618, which expands sex trafficking definitions to make it a crime to solicit or patronize a child for commercial sex acts or transport a child for that purpose. It will also make it easier for child sex trafficking victims to receive child protective services.
