Zonta UN Minute: Marge shared 6-4-3: Zonta International has projects in 6 countries, with 4 agencies, in 3 focus areas.

Treasurer's Report: Checking account balance is \$12,817.00 as of the end of February. Remember we are reimbursing our delegates for their actual expenses for the International Convention in Japan.

Race and Racism Committee: Met for the second time last week and agreed that we need to bring some common experience. The group read "Waking Up White" or watching the related Tedx Talk. The group is reading and learning to have discussions about these issues. Four broad areas of conversation: personal understanding, club effectiveness, impacting the community, and impacting the Zonta world. UN Committee Update



Remember the number 643 equals ZI and ZISVAW projects: 6 countries / 4 agencies / 3 project focuses – our international commitment.

Education is one of the 3 project focuses noted above. Zonta International is supporting education needs in both Madagascar and Vietnam.

"Let Us Learn Madacascar" is our US\$1,000,000 project in partnership with UNICEF USA to create opportunities for vulnerable and excluded girls, enabling them to realize their rights to an education in a secure and protective environment. With our partner, our goal in "Let Us Learn Madacascar" is to promote a common vision of investing in junior secondary education for girls as an entry point for equality.

"Greater Responsive Schools in Vietnam" is our US\$644,000 project with our partner the UN Trust Fund that supports "Plan Vietnam" in creating a school environment for adolescent girls and boys across Hanoi that is free from gender-based violence.

Suggested Reading: Education in Vietnam by Jonathan D. London

Vietnam is a country on the move. Yet contemporary Vietnam's education system is at a crossroads. Rapid economic growth has permitted rapid increases in the scale and scope of formal schooling, but there is a prevailing sense that the current education system is inadequate to the country's needs. Sunny assessments of Vietnam's "achievements" in the sphere of education have given way to a realization that the country lacks skilled workers. Some have even spoken of an "education crisis".

Education in Vietnam addresses key issues pertaining to the political economy of education, the provision and payment for primary and secondary education, and the development of vocational and tertiary education. The book marks an important contribution to existing understandings of Vietnam's education system and contributes to broader understandings of social conditions and change in contemporary Vietnam.
