Zonta Club of Milwaukee Meeting Minutes - Wednesday September 23, 2020

Zoom Meeting was called to order by Carol Mangold at 6:08.

Treasurer's Report: Maria Bellmann is unable to attend. She will make her report in October.

<u>Installation of New Member</u>: Crystal Carter was virtually installed by Cheryl Lucas DeBerry as the newest member of the Zonta Club of Milwaukee.

<u>Program</u>: Debbie Buchanan, Executive Director of Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative, made a presentation regarding the impact of the Club's donations.

Business - Committee Reports:

Service and Advocacy:

- Covid 19 Fundraiser: Donna Conant reported that a total of \$2,800 was raised. \$500 was previously distributed to each of the chosen four agencies. An additional \$200 is being sent to each of the agencies shortly.
- **Neu Life:** Donna Neal reported that she spoke with Jody Rhodes. Neu Life did operate on a smaller scale over the summer and are serving children now as the school year has started. They have made adjustments to keep everyone safe. Each of the children received Chrome Books. A studio has been opened to allow them to offer virtual services as well.
- Holiday Service Project: Joni requested members contact either her or Donna Conant regarding ideas for holiday giving. Neu Life will still have a need; although on a smaller scale.
- Zonta Says No March Walk: Donna Neal reported the postings planned for replacing the Walk:
 - Several of the personal stories from the End Abuse report.
 - o Sojourner Family Peace Center "#untilshecan" where individuals read survivor's stories.
 - Link to the domestic violence report issued in the Journal Sentinel related to domestic violence as a result of Covid 19.
 - Donna is waiting to hear back from the Waukesha Women's Center regarding to their purple silhouettes and how we can support that program.
- Racial Justice: Donna Neal reported that committee has 4 point proposal for the club. The entire proposal will be forwarded to Club to review.
 - 2 Club programs in a video format one in the fall and one in the spring. First one ("Tolerance for Cowards") will be shown at our October meeting.
 - o Bi-monthly optional discussions led by a committee member.
 - o Update resource list for club with a personal discovery tool.
 - o Advocacy create advocacy media to post during November's 16 days of activism.

Public Relations:

- Newsletters requested by 7th or 8th of the month.
- Joni will be posting the end abuse posting set out above.
- Auction posting continue to keep it in the front.

- Maureen proposed we continue to meet via Zoom through the end of the year. We will discuss again in January when in person meeting can resume.


UN:



Meet Carol Mangold!

The inequities in the opportunities available to and the treatment of females compared to males has troubled me since childhood. When I discovered Zonta, it seemed like a natural fit for me. I joined the Zonta Club of Douglas County, CO in 2012 where I served on the board and later transferred to the Zonta Club of Denver serving as Advocacy Chair. In 2018, we relocated to Plymouth, WI near a granddaughter. Pam Knackert contacted me, and I transferred to the Milwaukee club in July of 2019.

Dick, my husband of 44 years, and I have a blended family of six children, ten grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Sadly we lost a son, Jeff, in 2005. In the late 1960's - early 1970's, I struggled as a newly single mom raising 3 young boys alone for 7 years. This experience further cemented my commitment to promoting equality for



women. To this day, I have a special place in my heart for moms raising children alone. During those years, I completed my degree in nursing at the University of Texas, Houston.

My career over 30 years as a RN opened my eyes to more opportunities to empower women and girls. The years at the University of New Mexico Hospital enlightened me regarding the challenges facing Native American women. Returning to Houston, in 1990, my nursing career path took a different direction into oncology research trials at The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center and later I continued coordinating oncology clinical trials at the University of Colorado Anschutz Cancer Center.

Following retirement in 2010, I've resumed painting, watercolors and oils, and studying French. Grandchildren continue to be a major joy in our lives.

Since 2010, I've traveled on 4 mission trips to Africa and one to Nepal. Pre-COVID, Dick and I enjoyed traveling for pleasure. Travel opened my eyes to the impact of human rights abuses and abject poverty on women and girls around the world, so I'm participating in the Milwaukee Club's International Committee. My participation in the Racial Justice Committee has been an ongoing process in understanding systemic racism and it's impact on women.

Through Zonta, I've had the honor of meeting many accomplished and inspiring women. I look forward to serving as your Vice President and together we can make a positive impact in Milwaukee and the world.



October Is Domestic Violence Awareness Month


In lieu of our annual silent march this year, we have been posting data and stories about domestic violence, victims, survivors, and possible actions throughout the month. Much of the information is sourced from our partner End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin's annual Homicide Report – the info we usually share at the Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women Silent March. Follow and Share!



If you haven't been paying attention, start now. Visit our Facebook page, learn, and share what you are most struck by with your Friends. Here's a sample posting, in case you missed it:

In Wisconsin, in 2019, the majority of domestic violence homicide victims were adult females, but over one-third were adult males. Men and boys are not immune from being victims of domestic violence.

Over Half of Victims were Female



whom were male. While the risk of domestic violence homicide is more equal for females and males, most who commit the homicide are male. The behaviors exhibited by homicide victims and perpetrators vary by sex. Female perpetrators rarely engage in patterns of stalking, strangulation, increasing severity of violence, forced sex, threats to kill, and other coercive behavior that often characterizes homicides committed by males. Many homicides committed by females were preceded by an immediate or anticipated attack or a history of abuse by the homicide victim.


There were 730 domestic violence perpetrators of homicide in Wisconsin from 2000 to 2019, most of

Racial Justice

The Club Board met with the Racial Justice Committee at its August 11 meeting. We reached two agreements:

- Facilitate personal discovery/education of Club members: "Begin at home"
- Help find project(s)/action(s) to support: "Do something"

The Racial Justice Committee then developed a proposal for Zonta Club of Milwaukee programming and activities during the current biennium. That proposal has four components:

- Club Programs with video/discussion format, one for Fall and one for Spring
 - o "Tolerance is For Cowards" (upcoming)
 - Jane Elliott interview with Jimmy Fallon (March, May?)
- Bi-monthly topical discussions, optional for Club members
 - Virtual tour of Jim Crow Museum (Nov?)
 - Myths and Misconceptions that Endanger Black Women's Health (Jan?)
- Personal discovery tool and accompanying Resource List
 - o "Highly Recommended" shorter list (October)
 - More extensive list (November)
- Advocacy plans for October (Domestic Violence Awareness Month) and 16 Days of Advocacy

The detailed proposal was for your review after the September meeting. We will discuss and seek approval at the October meeting.
