Business - Committee Reports:

Service and Advocacy:

- Neu Life Holiday gifts: The link to Target for the Holiday gifts is in the newsletter. We committed to providing 45 gifts. Joni recommends that Zonta 2020 be entered so that we can track how many we provide. Approximately 60 gifts total are needed. All gifts need to be at Neu Life by December 15.
- 16 Days of Advocacy/Activism: We will be doing a series of 16 posts on Social media. They will have a consistent 2-sided format. Issues will be one side and possible solutions or actions on the other side. Everyone is encouraged to read, repost and share. The hope is that this could lead to a potential project for the club. Joni will also try to track which posts resonate most to lead to future newsletter or meeting programs. The committee will ask for feedback in December. The one exception is that on Tuesday, December 1, the Day of Giving, a post will be uploaded encouraging donations to our scholarship.
- Racial Justice: Our discussion last meeting was a difficult discussion. Lynne Oehlke moved that the Racial Justice Committee interview potential facilitators to organize a plan for future presentations to the Club. Jackie Beaudry seconded. Motion carried.

Advocacy



We supported Zonta International 16 Days of Advocacy with daily posts beginning November 25 and continuing through December 10. We hope you followed them, learned something new, and were stimulated to explore an issue in more depth. Sad but true, it's not hard to come up with 16 issues that are barriers to the empowerment of women and girls requiring advocacy and/or activism.

November was National American Indian Heritage Month. As members of Zonta International, we carry a Lakota Sioux name meaning honest and trustworthy. So in this newsletter it is appropriate that we honor some of the Native American women who, over the 20th century, advocated for their people in significant ways. Here are a few teasers regarding what five remarkable women accomplished. Find out more by using the links to their full stories..

"Princess Red Wing", a Winnebago woman, began her career in 1914 in the silent movies. Her goal was to ensure that Native Americans in the movies were depicted truthfully, accurately and not used as props for the "Cowboy and Indian" movies being filmed. There was an enormous discrepancy in pay between white and Native American actors which affected her, as a principal actor as well. What did she do about it

"Bright Eyes", an Omaha woman, believed that peaceful revolutions were slow but sure. She was committed to securing rights for her people which was extremely important to her as she was the daughter of "Iron Eyes", the last recognized chief of the Omaha tribe. Read about her "firsts" as well as how and where she directed her advocacy efforts.

A Wyandotte woman whose tribe were also referred to as "Huron" became known as the guardian of a cemetery that still stands today. As a lawyer her advocacy efforts took her to argue her case before the Supreme Court...before women could even vote! What were her causes and how did she fight "the powers that be?" Why were her causes so important to her personally?

"Yellow Bird Woman", a woman of the Blackfoot Nation, was a contemporary woman. As a small girl she watched the goings-on of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and the US Department of the Interior who refused to treat her people fairly when it came to finances and property. As she grew older she concentrated on her education to get herself in a position to right wrongs that had gone on through the mismanagement of these agencies. Read how she advocated for her people, what the results were and what stands today in memory of her advocacy.
