President's Message




Hello Sisters!

Wine pull – Once again, the wine pull will be a part of the fashion show this fall. Our idea is to create a **gift card tree** as another way to raise funds. The tree is loaded with gift cards hanging from the "tree" which can literally be a Christmas tree or any form from which things hang. Each card is in an envelope so that its value and purpose are not seen. A "buyer" pays \$20 and can select an envelope from the tree. They have been guaranteed that the value is at least \$20 but might be more.




Pam will take your bids!

UN Report



THE AMELIA EARHART STORY

Globally, women make up around 25 percent of the workforce in the aerospace industry. In an effort to carry out its mission that women have access to all resources and are represented in decision-making positions on an equal basis with men, Zonta International offers the Amelia Earhart Fellowship.

The Amelia Earhart Fellowship was established in 1938 in honor of **famed pilot and Zontian**, **Amelia Earhart**. The US \$10,000 Fellowship is awarded annually to up to 35 women pursuing Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace engineering and space sciences. It may be used at any university or college offering accredited post-graduate courses and degrees in these fields.

Since the program's inception in 1938, Zonta has awarded 1,674 Amelia Earhart Fellowships, totaling more than US \$11 million, to 1,245 women from 75 countries. Our Fellows have gone on to become astronauts, aerospace engineers, astronomers, professors, geologists, business owners, heads of companies, even Secretary of the US Air Force.

As some of you may know, Robert D. Ballard, has been tagged "the Underwater Cowboy." He has discovered famous shipwrecks like the Nazi warship "Bismarck," the aircraft carrier "U.S.S. Yorktown," and JFK's "PT-109." His latest book, "Into the Deep," tells the story of his most exciting expedition in his successful search for the U.S. Navy for the "Titanic." It also tells the story relevant to Zonta International and our Amelia Earhart Fellowships.

Amelia and her navigator, Fred Noonan, began their flight heading east from Oakland, California in May 1937. A month later, they had reached New Guinea and flown 22,000 miles. Amelia had then reported plane trouble, weather issues, and personal issues, possibly referring to Fred Noonan's drinking problems. She and Fred aimed to refuel at Howland Island, a tiny uninhabited speck in the central Pacific. As they neared the island. low on fuel, they encountered overcast skies and radio transmission problems. They reportedly were unable to find Howland Island as testified by a Coast Guard ship that was sent to help, but unable to locate them.

Over the years, some explorers have singled out Nikumaroro, 350 miles southeast of Howland and also known as Gardner Island, as the most likely place for her to have landed. Those who believed the plane crashed into the sea have conducted three major searches off Howland Island between 2002 and 2009. But they have come up with no clues. David Gillespie of TIGAR made an exploratory trip in 2012, but also failed to find conclusive evidence of her plane.

In 2015, Robert Ballard brought "Nautilus" to the Pacific. The "Nautilus" is an underwater vehicle fully equipped to search and record information at depths never before possible.

The "Nautilus" was scheduled to map the terrain near American Samoa, just north of Howland Island in the summer of 2019. Because Nikumaroro is not in U.S. waters, National Geographic stepped up to help finance a Ballard detour, thus becoming an important partner in Ballard's search for Amelia's plane. <u>Amelia Earhart was</u> a member of the Zonta Club of New York at the time of her tragic disappearance.

UN Report



As recently as August 8, 2019, Robert Ballard and his team steamed in the "Nautilus to an isolated coral reef, a part of Micronesia, Nikumaroro with camera carrying drones provided by National Geographic. Nikumaroro is a dormant volcano some 4.7 miles long and 1.8 miles wide with a downward sloping underwater terrain.

Nikumaroro is such a small slip of land that in less than a day Ballard and his crew were able to circle the island each time scanning to a depth of 12,000 feet. 3,000 images were collected while looking for the pieces of Amelia's plane. A 24 - hour vigil revealed nothing of interest: a long-degraded soda can, some foreign debris, etc.

In Ballard's own word: "Although we didn't find Amelia, I feel humbled at having been part of the search effort around her disappearance, and thankful for the opportunity to bring some exceptional people with me along the way. The search for a great woman and the relics of her success felt personal, important and timely. It's taken too long, but we're doing a better job of encouraging women to be scientists, engineers and leaders."

National Geographic wants Ballard to return in 2021 to search the other side of Nikumaroro for any signs that she might have been there. If that fails, Ballard will set his sights on the Howland Island theory in 2022. So, the search will go on!



P.S. Amelia Earhart visited Milwaukee, as reported in the Milwaukee Journal on Sunday, June 12, 1932 before the establishment of Zonta International's Fellowship program in 1938.
