





Our 6th Annual Zonta Says No Walk Against Violence Against Women will be held Monday, October 4 from 11:55-1:00. The Zonta Says NO Walk is a silent walk around the Milwaukee downtown area, beginning and ending at Milwaukee City Hall, for the purpose of remembering those Wisconsinites who died last year due

to domestic violence. Once again, we are partnering with End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin. Arrangements have been confirmed with the City of Milwaukee.

The walk is led by two Zontians carrying the Zonta banner, and individual walkers carry pennants recognizing the victims on a walk that is approximately 1 mile and takes about 30 minutes. Typically, we have received local TV coverage. *1F YOU ARE INTERESTED IN CARRYING THE BANNER, LET US KNOW!*

Following the walk, several community leaders will briefly comment on the issue of domestic violence, after which we will acknowledge those who fell victim in 2020. Shawn Mohammed, Associate Director of The Asha Project, will speak on behalf of End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin, the organization that publishes the annual Homicide Report. Other confirmed speakers include Carmen Pitre, President and CEO, Sojourner; District Attorney John Chisholm or his representative; Sargent Theresa Janick, Domestic Violence High Risk Team of the Sensitive Crimes Division, Milwaukee Police Department and Karin Tyler, Family Injury & Violence Prevention Manager from the Office of Violence Prevention. Still tentative is Cavalier Johnson, Milwaukee City Council President The event will conclude at 1:00 pm.

We are expecting to see an increase in the number of reported domestic violence deaths in 2020 vs prior years, due to the COVID19 pandemic. In past years we have welcomed about 50 marchers; **we would like to at least double the number of walkers**.

Here's what we ask from each of you:

- PLAN TO WALK, AND WALK WITH YOUR ZONTA SAYS NO T-SHIRT
- Invite friends and family to walk with us
- Invite members of other like-minded organizations to walk with us
- Pass on the names of organizations (and maybe a contact name) you think might walk with us to someone on the committee

TELL US IF YOU ARE WALKING AND HOW MANY ARE WALKING WITH YOU! GET TO CITY HALL BY 11:45 ON MONDAY, OCT 4!

Now is the time to ask others to join us in our march. It is a good opportunity for organizations to get some publicity for themselves! We welcome them wearing logoed merchandise in showing their support. We have a templated invitation letter that you can use – just ask.

UN REPORT – SEPTEMBER 2021

ZONTA INTERNATIONAL'S PARTICIPATION AND VISABILITY ON THE WORLD STAGE

The June 2021 Issue of "The Zontian" was issued virtually only. One of its content includes a summary of the 65th Session of the Commission of the Status of Women (CSW65) which, because of COVID-19 was forced to go virtual. Zonta International participated in this 65th Session of the Commission, being represented by our International President, Sharon Langenbeck.

<u>The Commission's Priority Theme was</u>: Women's full and effective participation and decision-making in public life, as well as the elimination of violence, for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls.

The Commission's Review Theme was: Women's empowerment and the link to sustainable development.

Zonta International issued a written statement to the CSW and co-sponsored two parallel events as part of the NGO CSW Virtual Forum.

The first event: Girls' Education: Access, Obstacles and Impact to Achieving Gender Equality, was hosted in partnership with UNICEF, USA. It addressed the connection between lack of access to education and the impact it has on girls around the world in relation to COVID-19, child marriage, poverty, violence, access to health services and infant maternal mortality, and women and girls' empowerment.

Zonta International President, Sharon Langenbeck was joined on a panel by Andrea Clemons, education specialist and interim head of education for UNICEF Madagascar, and Guadalupe Roman. Ms. Clemons is a Zonta International Young Women in Public Affairs Awardee.

President Sharon highlighted Zonta Foundation for women's work on girls' education at all levels, from postprimary education in Madagascar to doctoral studies in aerospace engineering and space sciences made possible through Zonta International Amelia Earhart scholarships.

She emphasized the importance of partnership and collective impact. Ms. Langenbeck shared how Zonta members are collaborating with like-minded organizations and mobilizing their communities around the world to empower women and girls, efforts that have continued despite the added challenge of COVID-19.
