### **War Memorial Exhibits**

Interesting exhibits at the War Memorial until the end of the year. Since Zonta had a part in the creation of the War Memorial here are a couple exhibits you and your families or friends might be interested in.

They have two exhibits onsite through the end of the year:

- 1. Operation 30/20, which explores the Wisconsin connections to the Persian Gulf War (30 years ago) and 9/11 (20 years ago).
- 2. I Am Not Invisible, featuring the female service experience. Thirty-two banners tell the stories of local female veterans and current military members. They launched this on Nov. 4 and have had great coverage since then, including the <a href="Milwaukee Journal Sentine">Milwaukee Journal Sentine</a> and the <a href="Milwaukee Bucks">Milwaukee Bucks</a>. In 2022, this exhibit hits the road, traveling to schools, libraries, community centers, places of business and government buildings (if you know of a place that would like to host this exhibit, let them know).

Also of interest this time of year is their Pearl Harbor tour, which sets the scene in Milwaukee on that fateful day and covers all the Pearl Harbor and Navy connections throughout the building and memorials.


