

Zonta International is pleased to announce that Jacqueline Beaudry and Amy Lai are the newest recipients of the Zonta International Meritorious Service Award, which recognizes exceptional member service to Zonta International and/or the Zonta Foundation for Women at the international level. They join a very select group of 10 prior Meritorious Service Awardees.

### Jacqueline "Jackie"

Beaudry has been a dedicated Zontian for 34 years. She has served at the club, district and international levels of Zonta International with distinction. As chairman of the Foundation's Centennial Anniversary Endowment Campaign (CAEC) Committee from 2014 to 2020, Jackie led the committee in raising US\$5.9 million for the Foundation's endowment funds and, thus, secured longterm sustainability for Zonta International's programs. Prior to her leadership of the CAEC Committee, Jackie led biennial fundraising efforts for the Foundation for three biennia, greatly increasing contributions from Zonta clubs and encouraging more donations from individual club members. Her work has created a legacy of greater giving by Zonta clubs and individual club members and provided Zonta International with the necessary resources to increase its support for its international service projects and education programs. In addition to her dedication and commitment to the Foundation, Jackie served as Interim Executive Director (2012-2013), International Director during the 2010-2012 Biennium and in multiple roles in District 6 and the Zonta Club of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, USA. Amy Lai has been a dedicated Zontian for 42 years. She has served the Zonta Club of Taipei I, District 31, Zonta International and the Zonta Foundation for Women with honor. As a member of the Foundation's CAEC Committee from 2015 to 2020, Amy raised US\$859,000 from District 31 for the Foundation's endowment funds and helped sustain Zonta International's programs for years to come. Prior to her service on the CAEC Committee, Amy supported Foundation fundraising efforts for many years as a Foundation Board Director (2003-2007) and as a member of the Foundation Development Committee (2003-2010) and has been a dedicated and generous supporter of the Foundation. In addition to her fundraising efforts, Amy served as a member of the International Nominating Committee (1998-2000) and as a member of the Centennial Anniversary Committee from 2010 to 2020.



The Zonta International Board is pleased to recognize these two dedicated and generous members of Zonta International who truly have served Zonta and have worked tirelessly in support of Zonta's mission to empower women and girls. ### **CROSS-CULTURAL COMMUNICATION AND COMING ATTRACTIONS**

After this month, our final session with Heidi will be scheduled for May or August. About a month before we meet, we will ask members to utilize the online Intercultural Conflict Style Inventory, an 18-item questionnaire and cross-culturally validated assessment tool, that we will be using and referring to in that meeting.

At Club meetings, we'll try to spend 10 minutes or so discussing what we've learned about culture and communication, and how we're incorporating the learning into our Zonta activities and plans, particularly recruitment and retention.

Moving forward, please forward any feedback you'd like to share -- on either the Club meetings, or on how the learning has impacted the way you think or behave -- with either Donna Neal or Donna Kahl-Wilkerson, and we'll make sure it gets in the newsletter.

Last fall we had about 75 walkers and received great media coverage. As Carmen Pitre from Sojourner said in her remarks at City Hall at last fall's event, "this atrium should be filled". We need to be <u>focused on building connections with other organizations that are concerned about the issue and will march with us.</u>

#### Maloney, Speier Lead Bipartisan Colleagues Urging Senate Leadership to Vote on ERA

WASHINGTON, DC – On International Women's Day, March 8, Rep. Carolyn B. Maloney, Chairwoman of the Committee on Oversight and Reform, and Rep. Jackie Speier, Co-Chair of the Democratic Women's Caucus, led a bipartisan group of House Members, including Democratic Women's Caucus Co-Chairs Rep. Lois Frankel (D-FL), and Rep. Brenda Lawrence (D-MI); Democratic Women's Caucus Vice Chairs Rep. Veronica Escobar and Rep. Sylvia Garcia (D-TX); and Rep. Tom Reed (R-NY), in sending a letter to Senate Majority Leader Charles E. Schumer and Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell urging them to schedule a vote on the Senate floor on the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) this month in commemoration of Women's History Month.

"In just a few weeks, on March 22, we will mark the 50th anniversary of congressional passage of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA). In anticipation of this anniversary, and as Members of Congress committed to constitutional equality, we write to request immediate action by the Senate to affirm the ERA as the 28th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. March is Women's History Month— the perfect time for this historic action," wrote the Members to Majority Leader Schumer and Minority Leader McConnell.

# <u>WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH</u> About the female icons seen on USA Today's cover 3/3/2022

Malala Yousafzai (1997- ) Yousafzai is a Pakistani activist who advocates for gender equality in education and female empowerment.

She first gained international recognition for her diary about her life under Taliban rule. At 15, she was shot in the head by Taliban terrorists for her campaign for female education in Pakistan.

In 2014, she became the youngest Nobel Prize laureate at the age of 17.

**Dame Jane Goodall** (1934- ) Goodall is an English primatologist and anthropologist famous for her observations and efforts to protect wild chimpanzees from extinction. Through her scientific research and environmental advocacy, she has spent nearly 60 years playing a key role in redefining species conservation with relation to their natural habitats and the local communities that surround them.

Maya Angelou (1928-2014) Angelou was an American author, poet and civil rights activist. She is considered one of the most renowned and influential voices in modern time

She rose to popularity in 1969 with the publication of her autobiography "I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings," shaking the literary world and opening doors for Black women and authors.

In 1993, she became the first female and first Black inaugural poet in U.S. presidential history.

Angelou was also awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2010.

**Anna May Wong** (1905-1961) Wong is considered the first Chinese American Hollywood star, appearing in more than 60 films throughout her career. She is recognized as an icon for her dedication to improve Asian representation in the film industry.

Wong was considered an international trailblazer for navigating blatant racism and "exotic" typecasting, which she was subjected to in a predominantly white industry. She was notably excluded from "The Good Earth," a 1937 drama that follows the lives of Chinese farmers, in favor of lead actors of German and American decent.

**Frida Kahlo** (1907-1954) Kahlo was a Mexican artist admired for her many bold selfportraits and paintings inspired by the nature and artifacts of Mexico. Her work is defined by intense, vibrant colors that illustrate pain and passion.

Today Kahlo is recognized as a feminist icon for her depictions of the female experience including abortion, miscarriage, birth and breastfeeding.

## **UN REPORT – Marge Holzbog**

Zonta International condemns aggression and acts of war and stands with our members in Ukraine. \*

Our International President has been in communication with our Zonta members in Ukraine and is inspired by their strength and resilience as evidence by their message:

"We are calm and resolute: we keep in touch with family and friends. The main thing is that we maintain our strength of spirit – then we will not be defeated."

"Today, Ukraine needs us, and we are called on to give a part of ourselves if we are to live in a democratic country governed by the rule of law."

Our International President, Sharon Langenbeck, stated: "As women and children move from Ukraine into neighboring countries, we encourage our global membership to use their voices to advocate to ensure that the safety and wellbeing of women and girls are at the forefront of the humanitarian response. (We know that in times of conflict and war, women bear the primary burden of keeping their families together, ensuring the safety and wellbeing of their children addressing the long-term emotional and physical damage inflicted by war.')

President Langenbeck further stated: "We also know that our members are generous and want to directly support Ukrainians and their immediate needs. While Zonta International is not positioned to respond to emergencies, we encourage our members to direct their support to relief organizations like our long-time partners at UNFPA and UNICEF that are already working on the ground in Ukraine and the nearby countries that are accepting refugees. District 27, of which Ukraine is a part, is working with local Zontians to assess and respond to their local needs."
