## **2022 Fashion Show Updates**

Zonta Milwaukee's fashion show **November 5, 2022** is taking shape. The save the date cards have been designed and sent, a delicious meal with some form of chocolate for dessert is confirmed and the fashion show itself has new twists involving Mt Mary's fashion design students.

What's left you ask: Generating contributions and attendees. Our Zonta club has consistently raised over \$24,000. each year which our Foundation then grants to programs serving women and girls through a competitive process. We can only accomplish this when every club member is involved and committed to our success. Please do your best and within your means to support the show.

#### What is needed?

- First, secure attendance of 8-10 people who come understanding that spending a little results in service to many women and girls.
- Second, ask businesses and banks you do business with to donate a service, a gift card, or a cash gift (the raffles/auction generated \$8,600.00).
- Third, a contribution of \$20 toward a bottle
  of wine (the wine pull generated \$900 last
  year) and a gift card worth at least \$20 (the
  gift card tree generated \$520 last year)
   Many of us have one or two gift cards
  collecting dust.
- Fourth, the auction baskets generate the most income (over \$8,000 last year). Club members are asked to donate a themed basket worth \$100 or greater. If your budget doesn't stretch that far, how about picking a partner with one or more (doesn't have to be a Club member) to construct a basket. If a filled basket isn't realistic for you, how about an interesting and related couple of items that can be used to stuff a basket. P.S. You don't need to supply the basket although it is appreciated. P.S.S It doesn't have to be a basket----any container large enough to hold items works wonders.

The scholarship committee selected Khadijah Dhoondia of Pewaukee, Wisconsin as the 2022 Young Woman in Public Affairs award recipient. Khadijah is currently a Senior at Pewaukee High School.

In high school Khadijah has held leadership roles in several organizations such as the National Honor Society and the Future Business Leaders of America. In college Khadijah plans to major in Neuroscience or Psychology on the pre-medicine track. Building on her undergraduate degree, she hopes to engage in an MD-PhD program as she aspires to be a physician-scientist.

Khadijah was named the Distinguished Young Women (DYW) of Pewaukee, Wisconsin. DYW participants engage in confidence-building programs designed to encourage young women to develop their individual potentials. Khadijah also is the co-founder and Chief Marketing officer of LOAF, an organization that contributes to the efforts of serving essential items, such as hygiene products, food, and clothing, to refugees and shelters. In addition to LOAF, Khadijah is also a Leadership Team Chair and Ambassador for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, a Girl Scout Silver Star Award recipient, a Model United Nations Representative, and a Sunday School Instructor.



In the future, Khadijah aims to support patients through clinical practice and contribute to scientific advancement through research. Outside of her career, Khadijah plans on volunteering her future skills in healthcare. She is interested in serving locally at the Waukesha Free Clinic and internationally with the Peace Corps.



# UN Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield Holder of a University of Wisconsin Master's Degree & Honorary Law Degree



Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield was nominated to be the Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations on January 20, 2021. She was confirmed by the U.S. Senate on February 23, 2021, and sworn in on February 24, 2021. She is our current UN Ambassador.

Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield, a career diplomat, returned to public service after retiring from a 35-year career with the U.S. Foreign Service in 2017. From 2013 to 2017, she served as the Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs where she led the bureau focused on the development and management of US policy toward sub-Sahara Africa.

Ambassador Thomas-Greenfield throughout her career has served in many African countries where Zonta has participated with UN agencies in projects related to the issues important to women and girls.

Ambassador Thomas-Greenfield's distinguished Foreign Service career included an ambassadorship to Liberia (2008-2012), and postings in Switzerland (at the United States Mission to the United Nations, Geneva), Pakistan, Kenya, The Gambia, Nigeria, and Jamaica. In Washington, she served as Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Bureau of African Affairs (2006-2008), and as Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration (2004-2006).

After retiring from the U.S. State Department in 2017, Ambassador Thomas-Greenfield led the Africa Practice at Albright Stonebridge Group, a strategic commercial diplomacy firm chaired by former Secretary of State Madeleine Albright. She was also the inaugural Distinguished Resident Fellow in African Studies at the Institute for the Study of Diplomacy at Georgetown University from fall 2017 to spring 2019.
