2022 Scholarships Now Available for Applicants

JMK Women in Business

\$1,000 + \$5,000

Women pursuing a business program with major field of specialization in accounting, economics, finance, business management, marketing, operations management, human resources management, international business, or entrepreneurship at an accredited university/college/institute, who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field, are eligible to compete in this tri-level (club/district/international) scholarship competition. Online students are eligible to apply if enrolled at an accredited university/college/institute.

Students must be enrolled in at least the second year of an undergraduate program through the final year of a Master's program at the time the application is submitted to the local Zonta club and must still be attending school at the time the scholarship funds are disbursed. (Download the application for complete details.)

In addition, Zonta Club of Milwaukee applicants must either: (1) have legal residency in the six-county Greater Milwaukee Metro area while attending any accredited university, college, or institute in the world or (2) be a full-time, out-of-state student attending an accredited university, college or institute in Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington, Ozaukee, Racine, or Kenosha counties.

The Zonta Club of Milwaukee awards one \$1,000 scholarship. The Club's winner's application is sent to Zonta International for consideration for one of 37 \$5,000 international scholarships.

Applicants must have an outstanding academic record, demonstrate intent to complete their chosen program, and show outstanding potential in their chosen field.

In addition, applicants must either: (1) have legal residency in the six-county Greater Milwaukee Metro area while attending any accredited university, college, or institute in the world or (2) be a full-time, out-of-state student attending an accredited university, college or institute in Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington, Ozaukee, Racine, or Kenosha counties.



Racial Justice

At this month's meeting, we will continue our discussion and learning about culture, dimensions of culture, and communication across cultures. Heidi Moore will facilitate.

<u>There is pre-work required for this meeting. It will take 20-30 minutes</u>. It can be completed all at once or in parts as you have the time.

<u>Begin with listening to one of these two short videos.</u> (For those less tech-savvy, 1) copy the Passcode, 2) click on the Link, 3) paste the password into the password box, and 4) click the play icon in the bottom left corner).

<u>Second, open the Pre-Read and Worksheet documents attached to this email.</u> The Pre-Read includes the list of remaining dimensions of cultural differences that we did not get to in the January meeting and provides a visual to help you think about the spectrum on each dimension.

Using the worksheet, mark your preferred style on each dimension of cultural differences. Also note Zonta Club of Milwaukee culture for each dimension. Bring the worksheet to the Club meeting.

- 1. Where on the spectrum for this cultural dimension do you see yourself (your preference)?
- 2. Where on the spectrum would you place the culture of Zonta Club of Milwaukee (your observation)?

Getting this pre-work done will save us a lot of meeting time and help us make sure that our meeting time is spent effectively. We'll be able to get right into the substance of each of the dimensions of cultural difference, and have meaningful conversations about where our members are, where we see the Club, and what that might mean. It will also prepare us for the next step – where we will explore conflict across cultures. More on that later (in the meeting).

A reminder of why we're doing this ... The Zonta Club of Milwaukee is seeking:

- Learning and competency development to help increase diversity in membership and enhance an inclusive culture.
- A shared understanding of definitions, language, and development of skills to maintain open discussion and dialogue about culture, diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Skills to incorporate learning into the fabric of the organization's culture.
- Engaging effectively through conflict and misunderstandings across cultural differences.




7th Annual Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women Silent Walk

UN REPORT – Marge Holzbog

Ukraine: New UN Women and CARE report highlights disproportionate impact of the war on women and minorities Date: Wednesday, 4 May 2022

After more than two months of war in Ukraine, which has forced millions of refugees and displaced people to flee their homes, a new Rapid Gender Analysis by UN Women and CARE reveals that women and minorities are facing immense hardship when it comes to health, safety, and access to food as a result of the crisis. In Ukraine, women are increasingly becoming heads of households and leaders in their communities as men are conscripted, yet they remain largely excluded from formal decision-making processes related to humanitarian efforts, peacemaking, and other areas that directly impact their lives.

Cease the war against Ukraine and resolve it peacefully and diplomatically, civil society organizations said in a joint statement

New York City, 4 March 2022 (CoNGO Infonews) – Civil society organizations that are predominantly women's NGOs today issued a statement against the war in Ukraine. The seven initiating groups called for "an immediate halt to hostilities, for all troops to be withdrawn, and for good-faith, peaceful, diplomatic negotiations to begin in a neutral territory." They issued the statement after the United Nations <u>General Assembly</u> and UN Secretary-General <u>António Guterres</u> have called for an immediate cessation to the conflict, outlining that it contravenes the UN Charter.
