Zonta International and Child Marriage

Globally, 21% of girls are married while they are still children, robbing them of their childhood.

In the last decade, about 25 million child marriages have been prevented. However, due to COVID-19, an additional 10 million girls are at risk of becoming child brides by 2030. The pandemic is fueling increased risk for child marriages by interrupting education, creating food and economic insecurity, disrupting programs and services, increasing adolescent pregnancy, and causing deaths of parents and caregivers.

The program's priority is engaging adolescent girls as key agents of change in the following 12 countries with high prevalence of child marriage: Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Sierra Leone, Uganda, Yemen, and Zambia.

HOW ZONTA HELPS

Zonta has supported ending child marriage since 2014, contributing US\$2 million to delay early marriage in Niger from 2014-2018. From 2018-2022, Zonta contributed US\$3.5 million to the UNFPA-UNICEF Global Program to End Child Marriage – the first private-sector donor to the Global Program.

In Phase I, almost 8 million adolescent girls were reached with life skills and school support, 39 million individuals engaged in community-based behavior change, and 26,000 schools strengthened their adolescent girl-friendly education. Zonta International's continued support will help advance the Global Program's realization of its vision in which girls everywhere experience healthier, safer and more empowered life transitions while they maintain control of their own destiny by making informed choices and decisions about their education, sexuality, marriage and childbearing. These positive changes hold the potential to transform the lives of millions of girls and families all around the world, helping girls enjoy their childhoods and reach a brighter future.

For the next two years (2022 – 2024), Zonta International has committed US\$1.2 million to UNICEF USA to support Phase II of the project.

<u>Scholarship - Clarified/Corrected Since the Meeting:</u> The scholarship committee is recommending that the ZI STEM Scholarship replace the current Zonta Club of Milwaukee STEM Scholarship. The rationale behind this decision is that the ZI Scholarship is now a two-level award.

There is a club-level award and then a single candidate from each of Zonta's 31 districts and one region will receive an award of US \$5,000 from Zonta International.

"The scholarship committee's recommendation is to discontinue the Zonta Club of Milwaukee's STEM Scholarship award of \$1000 and to add a ZI STEM Scholarship club-level award of \$1000."

Partial extract of the letter received.....



Dear charitable organization,

In 2013, we launched AmazonSmile to make it easier for customers to support their favorite charities. We were excited about the potential for the program and the impact it could have for many charitable organizations. We want to thank you for your partnership during all these years.

After almost a decade of running AmazonSmile, we learned that with so many eligible organizations—more than 1 million globally—our ability to have an impact was often spread too thin.

We are writing to let you know that we have made plans to wind down AmazonSmile by February 20, 2023. Until this date, customer purchases made via AmazonSmile will continue to accrue funds for your charity as normal. To help nonprofits like you plan ahead, we will also provide you with a one-time payment equivalent to three months of payments based on what you accrued in 2022 through this program. The timing of this final payment will be approximately 60 to 90 days after February 20, 2023. We hope that this will help minimize the impact that this decision might have.
