Goal 1 of the Zonta International Strategic Plan states

*“Zonta acts as a credible and visible voice on gender equity and delivers initiatives addressing education equality, **climate justice**, ending gender-based violence, and ensuring women are represented in decision-making positions on an equal basis with men.”*

*“Zonta will fully embrace **climate justice as an area of focus**, and we will further develop Zonta Says NOW as the flagship campaign for our activities to **address climate justice at local, national and international levels.**”*

Indeed, one of our current international service projects is “Engaging Girls on Climate Change in Madagascar”.

Why does climate change affect women and girls more than men? Because systemic gender inequality has led to women having fewer resources and choices than men. For women and girls, there already are

- Gender gaps in education
- Gender gaps in pay and economic opportunities
- Gender gaps in legal rights
- Gender gaps in leadership roles
- Gender gaps in health care resources

As climates change, women and girls experience increased health threats; food, water, and fuel insecurity; and conflicts over already limited resources. These threats can put women and girls in greater peril of exploitation, violence, and trafficking.

From Zonta International’s Statement on Climate Change: A Gender Equity Issue, International calls on its members to:

- *Increase their own awareness of climate change and on its gender-related consequences and raise awareness locally.*
- *Include gendered climate change advocacy actions in their advocacy plans*
- *Support the inclusion of women at the national and local tables of decision-makers on environmental sustainability.*
- *Promote girls’ education and the inclusion of climate literacy in schools, as well as to promote girls’ science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) studies to increase gendered scientific and technical contributions to climate change mitigation.*
- *Advocate for national policies that take into account women’s economic opportunities and ensures their full and equal participation in the economy.*

In the coming Newsletters, Advocacy Committee members will provide details about global climate change issues as well as local initiatives such as the City of Milwaukee’s *Climate and Equity Plan*.

Women's Equality Day – 2023

Women's Equality Day commemorates 26th August 1920 when votes to women officially became part of the US constitution. In 1971, Representative Bella Abzug championed a bill in the U.S. Congress to designate August 26th as "Women's Equality Day." The bill says that "the President is authorized and requested to issue a proclamation annually in commemoration of that day in 1920, on which the women of America were first given the right to vote.

This year's theme for Women's Equality Day is Embrace Equity. You might conclude that equality and equity mean the same thing. However, there is quite a distinction we should be aware of. **Equality** means everyone is treated the same exact way, regardless of differences. **Equity** means everyone is provided with what they need to succeed.

UN Report – August 2023

Zonta International is passionate about providing life-changing opportunities for women and girls through international service. By partnering with agencies of the United Nations and other recognized non-governmental organizations, Zonta has improved women's health, provided better economic opportunities and prevented gender-based violence in 71 countries. Since our first service project, Zonta has contributed more than US\$35.9 million to our international service projects.

In Peru – 2023-2024

The overall objective of UNICEF'S "Adolescent Girls' Health and Protection" project is to improve the capacity of services in districts Ucayali, Loreto, Huancavelica & Northern Lima in Peru to respond promptly to the health needs of the adolescent population and to prevent all types of violence in schools and other services.

The "Adolescent Girls' Health and Protection" project will contribute to guaranteeing the rights of indigenous and rural adolescents, especially girls, and respond to their needs by preventing pregnancy, addressing mental health concerns and providing a protective environment from violence by providing quality, gender-sensitive, and culturally adapted health, education and protection services.

In Papua New Guinea & Timore-Lest – 2023-2024

Building on Phase I and Phase II of "Her Health and Dignity" with our partner UNFPA, our priority is strengthening services for survivors of gender-based violence by expanding and strengthening skills, knowledge and capacities of GBV responders, including health care providers in additional geographic areas in Papua New Guinea (PNG) and Timor-Leste (TL).

The project will ensure that all women and girls who experience violence use quality essential services, including for long-term recovery from violence, in Papua New Guinea and Timor-Leste.

In Madagascar – 2023-2024

Engaging Girls on "Climate Change in Madagascar" will help UNICEF enable children, particularly girls, to learn in a safe and inclusive environment and empower them to take actions to change and to build climate-resilient communities. The targeted beneficiaries are residents of school communities in Beloha and Ambovombe districts in the region of Androy, the drought-prone region of the South.

This project will not only provide impact in the immediate and short-term, but also create robust enabling environments in which successful projects can be replicated at scale and be sustained in the long-term, thereby multiplying the impact on women, girls and boys over time.

In African Countries - 2023 - 2024

With Zonta's partner since 2020, UNFPA-UNICEF "Global Programme to End Child Marriage" in 12 African countries (Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Sierra Leone, Uganda, Yemen and Zambia), Zonta International's continued support will help advance the Global Programme's realization of its vision in which girls everywhere experience healthier, safer and more empowered life transitions while they maintain control of their own destiny by



making informed choices and decisions about their education, sexuality, marriage and childbearing. These positive changes hold the potential to transform the lives of millions of girls and families all around the world, helping girls enjoy their childhoods and reach a brighter future.
