## June 2024- Advocacy and "Silent No More"

#### **Community Meeting on Violence Report**

On May 16th, Donna Kahl-Wilkerson, Pam Knackert, Donna Neal and I attended a Town Hall gathering at Washington Park by the We Are Here MKE and led by The Asha Project. Entitled "All Hands On Deck Against Domestic Abuse & Community Violence: Centering Voices of the Community", community members, leaders, churches, and businesses attended this opportunity for discussion, learning, and gathering input about how to address the violence that is so prevalent in our communities and is taking younger and younger lives. Antonia Norton, The Asha Project Director, believes those closest to the problems are closest to the solutions.

My main take-aways were:

- There is a need for a collective response via culturally specific programs.
- There is a need to build back a sense of community. Take action if you see or hear abuse.
- There is a need to go into schools and teach civics.
- There is the need to "break a circle of violence" that has become the norm. Children without mothers enter foster care which can lead to additional exposure to violence.
- Revolving door loopholes in the legal system must be closed, loopholes that allow career criminals back on the streets.
- There is a much bigger need to get to the roots of violence and not just the effects of it. How much violence is due to high lead levels in water? How much to drug addiction? How much to poverty and prevalence of substandard housing?
- In Wisconsin, high racial disparities are correlated with high rates of domestic violence incidents for women of color. High racial disparities are correlated with structural racism.
- There is a need for men to reach out to other men and offer violence de-escalating programs.

#### <u>Summer Event – Neu-Life/ONG Collaboration and Celebration</u>

You may recall reading or hearing about a potential summer collaboration between Our Next Generation (ONG) and Neu-Life, where Neu-Life's Neu-STEPP, a healthy relationships program that includes significant educational segments on trafficking, would be offered at Our Next Generation. In the past, we have provided support to both organizations but this collaboration among the 3 organizations is a significant opportunity for all.

At our May meeting we reported that this collaboration is a "GO" for 3 groups of youths. At the end of the programs, a celebration is planned for Wednesday, August 7th @ 1pm at Our Next Generation. Also at our May meeting, the Club approved our engagement with both organizations and our support of the celebration.

- How would our Club's participation in this event assist both ONG and Neu-Life?
- 1. We would provide funding for commemorative hoodies, the printing of promotional brochures featuring ONG, Neu-Life & Zonta, & some portion of the food served.
- 2. The Club, Foundation, & members would underwrite an estimated \$1500 of expenses via: \$1000 allocated but unspent in the current Club budget for Advocacy activities; \$500 allocated from Foundation or project-designated donations to Foundation; with any hoodie overages covered by at least 3 members of the Event Search Team. We would expect as many Club members as possible to be present, wearing their orange T-shirts or a commemorative hoodie, which we will make available for order at cost.
- How would this event benefit the Club?
- 1. Spreads Zonta's Mission to eliminate violence and human trafficking
- 2. One of Zonta's Strategies is to strengthen partnerships that can carry out this mission
- 3. Another Strategy is to become visible in the Community and the neighborhood is invited. Our presence there & on promotional materials increases that visibility. [similar to our presence at the We Are Here MKE

- 4. At the August Celebration, we would be quite visible to the Mayor of Milwaukee, The Milwaukee County Executive, District 3 of the Milwaukee Police Dept., and the City's Office of Community Wellness and Safety which have already agreed to attend.
- 5. We would also be visible to the local media and like-minded organizations.
- What might the Future bring?

If the Neu-STEPP program is successfully evaluated by a 3rd party (possibly UWM) this fall (timing TBD), it can be utilized by other youth organizations, thus making a major step forward in violence and trafficking prevention throughout Milwaukee and around the Country.

At the Club's May meeting, some members asked how the proposed collaboration with Our Next Generation and Neu-Life Community Resource Center fits with the goals of Zonta International. Our linkage with ZI goals is strong and multi-dimensional.

"Zonta will build upon the long-term success of Zonta Says NO as the campaign for our international, national and local activities for addressing gender-based violencg." (Goal 1)

"While maintaining its focus on service, Zonta International will place a greater focus on advocacy and in doing so, increase Zonta's credibility and visibility on issues facing women and girls in the world." (Goal 1)

"Increase focus on the value of Zonta clubs to deliver impact in their local communities." (Goal 2)

"Zonta International will recognize and celebrate meaningful local projects addressing gender equity, education equality, climate justice, women in decision-making positions or gender-based violence." (Goal 2)

"Zonta creates customized pathways to connect to Zonta, develops collaborations with like-minded organizations, and expands revenue streams to further our mission and extend our voice." (Goal 4)

"Seek out new collaborations with likeminded organizations to expand alliances, partnerships, and sponsorships." (Goal 4)

## A Brief Back Story: Zonta Club of Milwaukee, Neu-Life, and Human/Sex Trafficking Prevention

Zonta Cub of Milwaukee engaged in a formal partnership with Neu-Life in 2016.We started with support of back-to-school backpacks, holiday gifts, and support of their annual Art Show fundraiser among other ad hoc activities.

From 2013 to 2016, there were 340 youth involved in sex trafficking in Milwaukee, and 20 incidents of sex trafficking in the 53206 zip code. In response, in late 2016/early 2017, we explored human trafficking prevention programs and decided on ARTREACH, an interactive creative arts program developed by Florida Zontian Nola Theiss, who founded the non-profit Human Trafficking Awareness Partnerships. Nola came to Milwaukee in spring 2017 and trained us, and then we implemented the program with Zontians, Neu-Life staff, and then Neu-Life High school and middle school youth. This evolved over a couple of



years, as we worked to modify it for broader implementation. In 2018, there was a public exhibit of the artwork created by the youth in the program at Milwaukee Public Library, Main Branch.

While adapting and facilitating ARTREACH, Neu-Life staff realized that a more comprehensive approach to the subject was needed. There was a gap to be filled defining healthy relationship practices before exploring the sensitive content of human sex trafficking. No suitable program existed, so Neu-Life decided to build a custom curriculum. That curriculum, Neu-STEPP (Sex Trafficking Education and Prevention Program), has been developed and improved over the past several years, with some meaningful Zontian contributions, and is now striving for third party verification.
