A volunteer for the Zonta International and U.N. monthly newsletter updates is still needed. Please let me know if you have an interest in this.


If you are not currently serving on a committee, your participation is both welcome and needed.





## 2025 Club of Milwaukee Women in Business Leadership Award Recipient

The awards committee selected **Jaquilynn Huff** as the 2025 Women in Business Leadership Award recipient.

Jaquilynn currently serves as Co-Chair of the LINC Donor Network at United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County and as a board member for Playworks Wisconsin. Additionally, she is currently the Vice President of the National Council for Mortar Board, a national collegiate honor society that promotes scholarship, leadership, and service. Jaquilynn's involvement with Mortar Board spans five years, beginning as chapter president at the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee and evolving into a National Vice President volunteer role where she supports student leaders across the country. Jaquilynn is currently employed by the Girl Scouts of Southeastern Wisconsin as a Community Outreach Specialist.

Jaquilynn's entrepreneurial spirit is reflected in the founding of the Milwaukee chapter of the Wisconsin Women's Network's year-long mentoring program. This initiative, offered at no cost to participants, connects women across industries to foster professional development and peer mentorship. The goal is to ensure women have equitable access to opportunities that advance their careers and leadership potential.

Jaqulynn's career aspirations are to build and lead social impact programs in partnership with corporations,

creating shared value for businesses and communities. She believes that meaningful, sustainable change is possible when companies invest strategically in initiatives that serve both their business goals and community needs.

To support her professional growth and deepen her strategic capabilities, Jaquilynn has been accepted into the Executive Program in Social Impact Strategy at the University of Pennsylvania. This opportunity will provide her with the tools and global network necessary to develop innovative programs that promote equity, especially for women and girls, through collaborative, cross-sector solutions. With the knowledge gained from this program, Jaquilynn aims to expand her impact by creating scalable models for community engagement, empowering women in the workforce, and driving lasting change.





## **Advocacy**

In the Club's June Newsletter, I mentioned that State Rep. Shelia Stubbs (D-78<sup>th</sup> Assembly District) planned to reintroduce a bill to create a task force to address missing and murdered Black women and girls. Last year such a bill was passed in the State Assembly but was blocked in a State Senate committee for months and never made it to the floor for a vote.

On July 25<sup>th</sup>, Rep. Stubbs reintroduced a bill to create a 17-member task force to examine the systemic causes of violence African American women and girls face and develop policy solutions to prevent others from going missing and being murdered. Coauthors of the new bill include Rep. Pat Snyder (R-Weston), Sen. Jesse James (R-Thorp) and LaTonya Johnson (D-Milwaukee). The bill includes one position supported with state funding of \$80,200 in 2025-26 and \$99,500 in 2026-27.

This initiative is supported by State Attorney-General Josh Kaul and Gov. Tony Evers who included a task force in his budget proposal, but the Joint Finance Committee did not include it in the final budget proposal. However, there appears to be more compromise possible in this legislative session.

"People are ready to step up," Kaul said. "The problem now is not whether there is interest among folks in collaborating and working to identify solutions. What we need is legislative will. We need the legislators and the Senate and the Assembly to pass legislation that will help ensure we have this task force... It's clear that there is a need not just for action, but for there to be an investment so that we can seriously consider these issues."


For newer Club members who may not be aware that Amelia Earhart was a member of Zonta International, the Amelia Earhart Fellowship (\$10,000 each) was established in 1938 in honor of the famed pilot who was mysteriously lost in 1937 trying to fly around the world. For those Club members of a certain vintage, we have been following several attempts over the decades to locate her plane and artifacts.

Now we learn in a Weekend Exclusive in the *Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel* that "a new expedition may just be what one official described as the "greatest opportunity ever" to finally bookend the enduring mystery. On July 2, the Purdue Research Foundation and the Archaeological Legacy Institute announced a joint effort to locate Earhart's plane in a lagoon off a Pacific island

between Australia and Hawaii, where a popular theory suggests Earhart and her navigator, Fred Noonan, may have landed on May 20, 1937.

A field team of researchers on Nov. 5 will journey by sea to the island Nikumaroro, part of the Phoenix Islands in the western Pacific Ocean, to determine whether a visual anomaly known as the "Taraia Object," seen in satellite and other imagery in the island's lagoon, is what remains of Earhart's plane. They will spend five days on Nikumaroro inspecting the "Taraia Object," according to the Purdue Research Foundation. If the initial expedition proves successful, the field team plans to return in 2026 to uncover and help return what remains of Earhart's plane, the foundation said. -- Diane Lindsley
