Monthly Zonta Meeting


Club Dinner Meeting: August 28th 5:30 Arrival & Social 6:00 – 8:00 pm meeting

This event also celebrated the collaboration between Our Next Generation (Zonta member La Toya Sykes) and Neu-Life (Zonta member Joann Harris-Commodore). In the past, we have provided support to both organizations but this collaboration among the 3 organizations is a significant opportunity for all.

Neu-Life provided Neu-STEPP programming for kids at ONG. Neu-STEPP is a healthy relationships program that includes significant educational segments on trafficking.

Milwaukee Domestic Violence High Risk Team Update

Members will remember a presentation given to the Club last October by Carmen Pitre from Sojourner during which she revealed a pilot program that provides a GPS tracker to a person in a high-risk situation. Disguised as an everyday item, the device has a button that can trigger a GPS tracker, an emergency call to law enforcement and upload a case file automatically to dispatchers. It is waterproof and military-grade tough and able to withstand attempts at destroying it.

What we didn't know was that the device was developed by Shorewood resident Liz Kohler, the sister of a woman who was killed in a domestic violence-related homicide in 2007. She is hopeful the new technology will become a resource for law enforcement agencies and domestic violence shelters around the world. In an interview with the *Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel* in June, Ms. Kohler said "About 60 people used it during a pilot project last year. According to Kohler, more than 90% of users reported reduced levels of post-traumatic stress symptoms, better perceptions of law enforcement and an overall improved sense of safety. Police response times for emergency calls from the device were seven times faster than average."

In that same article, Carmen said the Sojourner serves about 10,000 clients per year, 75% of whom are considered high risk of lethal violence. Only 60 people were able to use it last year during the pilot program. Obviously, a lot more fundraising is needed.

Human Trafficking Update

It is so gratifying that bipartisan legislation is still possible in Congress.

On July 9th, Sens. Jon Ossoff (D-GA) and Marsha Blackburn (R-TN), Chairman and Ranking Member of the U.S. Senate Human Rights Subcommittee, introduced the bipartisan *Supporting Victims of Human Trafficking Act*, which would cut red tape to better respond to the needs of service organizations working with victims of human trafficking and create additional flexibility in certain grant programs.

The bipartisan bill would strengthen the U.S. Department of Justice's Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) to provide more flexibility in funding for programs serving victims of human trafficking. The bill would also help increase training and technical assistance for grantees to help organizations receive Federal funding.

On May 7th, Sens. Ossoff and Blackburn's bipartisan *REPORT Act* was signed into law, which will strengthen the national tipline run by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) to collect reports of online exploitation and requires evidence to be preserved for a longer period, giving law enforcement more time to investigate and prosecute crimes.

On April 21st, Sen. Ossoff's bipartisan *Preventing Child Trafficking Act* with Sen. Chuck Grassley (R-IA) passed the U.S. Senate to help prevent child trafficking by strengthening coordination between the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

It was the culmination of a massive, peaceful civil rights movement by women that began in 1848 at the world's first women's rights convention, in Seneca Falls, New York.
