President's Message



Greetings Zonta Sisters,

Thanks to everyone who worked hard to make our Fashion Show Fundraiser another successful event on October 19th. A special thanks to Pam Knackert and Jackie Beaudry for their many hours spent co-chairing the event. On top of having a good time, we were able to help support nine local agencies and two scholarships from the funds raised in 2023.

November 25th is the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. This date kicks off our 16 Days of Activism To End Gender-Based Violence campaign finishing on December 10th, Human Rights Day. During these 16 days, Zonta clubs are actively calling attention to the need to change



laws, attitudes, and behaviors pertaining to violence against women and increasing awareness of the problem. Our Zonta Milwaukee Advocacy Committee, under the leadership of Diane Lindsley, has been busy updating topics to post on social media during the 16 days addressing domestic violence, child marriage, climate change, the ERA, loss of Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding, and more.

Advocacy is essential to accomplishing the strategic goals of Zonta in making a better world for women and girls. In addition to preparing data for social media during the 16 Days of Activism, members of the Advocacy Committee follow progress on legislation to End Child Marriage, enacting the Equal Rights Amendment, human trafficking, and other related issues. The committee facilitated hiring a consultant to heighten cultural awareness, diversity, and conflict resolution for our club. In years past the Zonta Club of Milwaukee has advocated against domestic violence by organizing a Silent Walk in downtown Milwaukee to honor and create awareness of those who've lost their lives to domestic violence in Wisconsin. I encourage you to consider joining the Advocacy Committee and contributing your ideas to this important part of our mission.

Zonta International is offering free webinars on various topics over the next few months. You can sign up for those topics of interest to you by opening <u>zonta.org</u> - News & Events - Events and view the list. There are five scheduled in November including A New Member Orientation on November 21st at 9:00 AM CST. It's a great opportunity to keep informed on the work of Zonta.



Please bring your items to the November meeting.



Advocacy

November honors Native Americans and the formation of the Confederation of Zonta Clubs.

From the Club Historian:

Every year, by statute and/or presidential proclamation, the month of November is recognized as **National Native American Heritage Month**. It is also the month, back in 1919, that the **Confederation of Zonta Clubs** was established.

While working in a prominent role at the Buffalo Express, during a time when women were rarely in leadership positions, Marian de Forest (1864-1935), reporter, playwright, promoter of the Buffalo, NY Symphony conceived the idea of an organization that would bring together women in executive positions. She envisioned a strong network that would help women reach their rightful place in the professions. She understood how important it was to break through the "glass ceiling", long before the term was ever used. On 8 November 1919, at the Hotel Statler in Buffalo, the Confederation of Zonta Clubs was founded as a service organization of executive women working to improve the status of women worldwide. The word Zonta comes from a Lakota Sioux Indian word that means "honest and trustworthy".

It is therefore fitting to remind Zontians of their ties to the Lakota Sioux, also known as the Teton Sioux. The Lakota are the largest and westernmost of the three groups and are located in North and South Dakota. The word "Lakota" means "friends" or "allies". The Sioux were a confederation of tribes that originated in the areas of present-day Wisconsin, Minnesota, Illinois, and Iowa. They were known for their hunting skills and warrior culture and were once one of the largest indigenous groups in North America.

In one of her early speeches, Marian de Forest explained, "Zonta stands for the highest standards in the business and professional world,...seeks cooperation rather than competition and considers the Golden Rule not only good ethics but good business". She envisioned Zonta stretching across the country and beyond. In her own words, "This is the woman's age and in distant lands and foreign climes women of all nations are

rallying to the call...Zonta is given the opportunity of uniting them into one great, glorious whole".

Help Needed With Dissemination of Scholarships

- We have had a significant decrease in applicants for all of our awards over the past few years. We welcome any ideas club members may have to get the word out!! In late October three companies were contacted that support non-profit organizations (for a price) with the marketing and dissemination of scholarships/awards. We have not heard back from any of them yet.
- 2) We also have the added challenge of disseminating the revamped Women in Zonta STEM Award to applicants ages 18-35. Eligible applicants may apply for the award to support their post secondary education costs, groundbreaking research, pioneering discoveries, and/or exemplary contributions to advancing knowledge and innovation in a STEM field. 




Book Corner – Club Sharing of Outstanding and Inspirational Women

This month's featured book is "The Sicilian Inheritance," by Jo Piazza. Both Joni Reese and I have read it and would recommend it. This is a work of historical fiction, with a touch of mystery about a possible murder, that takes us back and forth from the early 20th century to the early 21st century in Sicily.

When her great aunt dies in 2016, Sara is left with a plane ticket, a deed to a plot of land, her aunt's ashes and instructions to investigate her family history in Sicily including the death of Sara's 2nd great grandmother, Serafina. Digging up the past soon puts Sara's life in

The story delves into Sicilian history and culture, the challenges faced by women and the ingenious and resourceful ways they managed to survive and support each other in a harsh world controlled by men. Women living in rural Sicilian villages often consulted "la Strega," in secrecy. These female healers, thought to be witches with healing powers, offered natural treatments for a variety of ailments and served as midwives.

The story written from the perspective of the two main characters, Serafina and Sara, will hold your interest and perhaps inspire you to learn more about Sicily and the women of the early 20th century. *Carol Mangold*

Zonta Club of Milwaukee General Meeting October 23, 2024 Minutes

President Carol Mangold called the meeting to order at 6:00pm CDT following social time at the New Berlin Public Library. The meeting was attended by 15 members; no guests.

Program:

Angela Mancuso, Executive Director of The Women's Center in Waukesha began her presentation thanking the foundation for funds presented at the fashion show and recognition of the long-standing support of domestic violence issues by Zonta Club of Milwaukee.

She reviewed the impact that the center continues to have as the oldest women's shelter in the community, including:

11,000 people provided service

7,799 hours of support and education

20,746 instances of engagement

9,013 nights of safe shelter (average stay is now 49 days)

The only 24-hour hotline (even throughout the pandemic)

3,934 attendees at community education sessions (including law enforcement)

These are just some of the amazing statistics for 2023. Angela provided a brochure and copy of the 2023 Annual Report as a take-away for our members.

The center will be impacted by funding cuts; however they have been successfully fundraising for years and do not expect any reduction in services.

Financial Report:

The report was deferred as Treasurer Laureen Ward was not present. The reimbursement for liability insurance premiums by the foundation was questioned, but later confirmed receipt that will be accounted for next month.

Fashion Show Update:

Kudos to Co-chairs Pam Knackert and Jackie Beaudry for all of their time and talent planning and executing this successful event. Every member's participation and donation is appreciated. Approximately 240 reservations was down from last year. Proceeds are expected to be near \$25,000.

Initial feedback from the surveys was very positive about the fashion show's diversity in the models and styles. The food was noted as needing improvement; mostly that it was served cold. Pam has already raised this concern to Mariott planners.

The committee will hold a debriefing on November 19, 2024. Send any comments you wish to be heard to Pam or Jackie prior to the meeting.

Several attendees asked about the Club's 100th anniversary event. Discussion surrounded whether this event should be an extension of the fashion show in 2025, instead of the fashion show, or in addition to the fashion show as a separate fundraising event. It was requested that suggestions be directed to the Board for consideration. The Board can then provide direction (or recommendations) as it should be in the initial planning stage at this time. The actual anniversary date is January 8, 2026.





Fall Conference Update:

Club attendees in Carmel, IN October 4th-6th shared the emphasis at this meeting was on planning initiatives at the District level, taken from Zonta International. Four key goals will be identified and presented at the Spring Workshop May 17, 2025 (Milwaukee Club hosting) and then discussion at the Club level before the Board makes recommendations on actions.

Committee Reports:

- Fashion Show as noted above
- Finance as noted above.
- Foundation All 9 selected organizations were present to receive funds at the fashion show. Further
 opportunities are being considered to support these agencies in addition to the grants.
- Membership The annual Prospective Member Reception/meeting will be held at MRA in Pewaukee on November 20, 2024 from 5:30 – 7:30pm. A personal follow-up by members with guests of the fashion show that indicated interest was requested. A copy of the invitation is available electronically. Please see the sign-up sheet for contributing refreshments. A short Club meeting will follow; plan to stay until 8pm.
- Program December Club meeting location was to be determined. Post-meeting, Christine Todd was able to secure the community room at San Camillo for December 18, 2024. Details will follow.
 - January and February Club meetings will be held virtually. March and future meeting plans to be determined.
- Scholarship no report as there is no current activity.
- Service The Club supported The Women's Center of Waukesha this evening with donations of items on their list of 'badly needed'.
 - Discussion about supporting Allies for Teens in Foster Care again this year for their holiday contributions was unanimously decided. Likely that items will need to be collected at the November meeting.
- Public Relations Facebook has been updated and pictures from the fashion show were posted. Grant recipients were tagged for greater visibility. Members are encouraged to share and repost social media.
 - Articles for the newsletter are due to Joni Reese by the 7th of each month. A new element was added to highlight books about women's challenges and triumphs for suggested reading. Send your recommended reviews to Carol Mangold.

- Z Club Chairperson Nola Hitchcock Cross attended the meeting October 10, 2024. The school's coordinator, Kate Gay attended the fashion show. The school dictates the meeting calendar, so the November meeting will fall on Election Day. For this reason, the charter meeting will be deferred until January. It was suggested that we have a group of club members attend on the official charter day. The mothers of Z-Club members may be new prospective Club members.
