President's Message




Dear Zonta Sisters,

Welcome to our newest member, Janan Atta-Najeeb, who joined our club at the August meeting! We are so happy to have her on board and look forward to getting to know her better. Please take an opportunity to introduce yourselves to Janan and welcome her if you haven't had the chance to meet her yet.

We have several new and exciting opportunities coming up this Fall. Cathy Myers, our Area 2 Director, is proposing a Wisconsin Assembly Lobby Day at the State Legislature to End Child Marriage in Wisconsin and in support of a Wisconsin ERA. Improved funding for domestic violence may also be on the agenda. Staff at the legislature have informed Cathy that the bills can be worked up in time if given enough notice and suggested November 18th as the best date. That date could also tie in with the 16 Days of Advocacy. Cathy lobbied Congress in 2017 for the Citizen's Climate Lobby and has experience organizing teams and holding conversations with our elected officials. The Madison Club Advocacy Committee is hosting a Zoom meeting on September 23rd at 5:30 PM to start organizing, so consider joining the call and learning more about the plan. Also, Cathy plans to obtain a room in the State House for training and organizing before our appointments. If you've never lobbied before, or if you have, this is a great opportunity to participate in your government to advocate for the causes Zonta supports. I had the opportunity to lobby our Colorado representatives in



Washington DC back in 2009 for a medical research funding bill and it was a good experience. Please let me know as soon as possible if you are interested in participating in a Lobby Day and I will send a list to Cathy.







Fashion Show 2025


Save the Date: Saturday, November 15, 2025 at the Marriott Milwaukee West




Centennial Celebration Planning

Centennial Committees have been established, several are well underway, and others are in process of scheduling start-up meetings. The committees are Venue, Program & Entertainment, Logistics, Fundraising, Publicity, and History. Get involved if you haven't already!

The Core Team thanks all members who attended the August meeting and provided feedback and input on our fundraising signature project. There was lots of healthy, constructive discussion. Housing was raised as an important area to look for a project, and the Core Team will bring a new idea in this space to the Club meeting next week, along with short initial write-ups of the three paths we're pursuing at this point.

The History Committee will be sharing "stories" through the next year, as we all become more knowledgeable about our past and our predecessors and their achievements.



What were the Confederation of Zonta Clubs and the Zonta Club of Milwaukee up to 100 years ago?

National President, Ethel Francis of Detroit, attended the "birth" of the Milwaukee Zonta Club in January 1926. In her address she spoke on the aims and ideals of Zonta:

"The national aims of Zonta is (sic) vocational guidance. We want to help the younger generation of girls who are entering the business world. We are doing this by sending questionnaires to each Zonta in the country, to find out conditions among women who are in business. These, when compiled, make a valuable source of information for girls who are entering the business world. They can learn what chances there are for them in their chosen occupations in every part of the country, what the salaries are and whether there is a surplus of workers of their kind. In fact, anything about the business conditions that they might want to know.:

(Milwaukee Journal, January 9, 1926)

Within the first month of its existence, each of the Club's 45 members received the extensive survey used by the Detroit Club. Questions included:

- Type of work: people/things, responsibilities, decision-making, public-facing
- Extent, status, and schedule of work: hours, overtime, frequency of overtime
- Working conditions: healthy pleasant atmosphere, standing/stooping/lifting, physical/nervous strain
- Compensation: starting wage, next advance, maximum wage, salary/commission/service fee, promotions
- Methods of entering the workforce

Scholarships for girls entering the industrial workforce were one of the Club's first service projects, and workforce issues remained a priority for decades. A key partner was the School for Workers at the University of Wisconsin, created in 1925 so also a "newborn", only the second school of its kind in the nation. Zonta scholarship students attended the special 2-week summer sessions for years. The school continues to this day.



One of our most common conversations is why people haven't heard of Zonta.

The short answer is because we don't talk about the Zonta organization or our clubs enough!

A few days ago, I was on my personal Facebook page and saw this post in one of the retired women's groups I follow.

It made me so happy! I also recognized some of the people who were in the photo from NAIDM.

The message resonated with me, since I have seen many previous comments regarding people not knowing what to do with themselves after they retire. Their work defined them.

There are **210 thousand members** in this group! When I last looked, there were 279 reactions on it, and 62 comments from people! Some were interested and others jumped in from all over the Zonta world to comment on it like I did!

Let this be a lesson for all who read this, including me! Let's share Zonta with others!

Recently, some members have mentioned that they do not have enough meaningful activities in their retirement. I would like, if allowed, to introduce this group to Zonta International. I have been a member for 25 years and it is keeping me busy in my retirement. Zonta works to build a better world for women and girls and is broken down into districts, areas, and clubs. Zonta International holds General Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council and Participatory Status with the Council of Europe. We work both locally and internationally and are active in 67 countries. One major international project right now is to end child marriage worldwide and we are always working on ending gender based violence. Interesting note: Zonta was the only non aviation related organization Amelia Earhart ever joined and we give many graduate fellowships to women in her name. News from Allies for Teens in Foster Care

Since 2019, Allies for Teens in Foster Care has been dedicated to supporting teens living in group homes – providing shoes, meals, essentials, art supplies, educational support, and most importantly a reminder that they are seen and valued. As an all-volunteer non-profit, Allies distributed high quality goods and services to teens in over 20 teen foster care group homes in Milwaukee County. Carrying out our mission with respect, safety and integrity for the youth and adults we serve has been the foundation of our service.

After thoughtful planning and reflection, our board has made the decision to sunset our organization. This is not a result of crisis, but rather a proactive and values-aligned choice to bring our work to a close with intention and care, ensuring that our mission lives on through partnerships with aligned organizations.

For the past four months, Allies has been working with our partners to distribute our remaining donations. The principal project took place on August 5th - "Shoes for Teens." Teens from over 12 group homes came to the DSW in Wauwatosa in a two-hour window, and Allies purchased over 125 pairs of shoes for over 75 teens in Milwaukee group homes.

The project was such a success that Allies secured it for two more years with financial support in a targeted donation to the fellow non-profit, Bridge to Brighter. Allies reached out to Bridge to Brighter because we deeply admire their work with young men who aged out of foster care and recognize a strong alignment between our missions.

A sincere thank you to our current and past board members, Reagan Jauch, Sarah Dupee and Matthew Byrne. Allies would not have had the privilege of serving youth in our community without your time, talent, and commitment.

Thank you to our community donors and volunteers. Allies touched the lives of so many because you shared our mission. The gratitude Allies received is gratitude to you. You made kids feel seen.

I, Allison Byrne, will continue to help "Shoes for Teens" as a volunteer. I will also remain connected to several group homes, including the local group home working with pregnant teens and their young children. I will remain a volunteer bridge to Allies' partners wishing to continue support.

Zonta Club of Milwaukee Club Meeting Minutes August 27, 2025

President Carol Mangold called the meeting to order at 6:30pm CDT following the blessing and social/dinner time.

Pam Knackert led the induction of new member, Janan Atta-Najeeb. Donna Neal is her sponsor, and Diane Lindsley will be her mentor.

Treasurer's Report: Laurie Ward reviewed the financial statements for the months of June and July. Expenses were related to the Spring Workshop and the donation in place of the outstanding/now void check for the speaker. Beginning balance June 1, 2025: \$10,210.35. Ending balance July 31, 2025: \$8,373.71. CD balance: \$5,940.01 (Maturity date is 5/13/26.)

Committee Updates:

<u>Awards (Scholarship)</u> - Jackie Beaudry reported that the S.T.E.M. award application deadline is 10/15/25. The recipient will receive \$2,000 and be eligible for \$10,000.

100th Celebration – In place of a program, Dawn Zehren facilitated a working session outlining the initial planning and soliciting input from members on the event to be held November 7, 2026 at The Garage at the Harley-Davidson Museum. The goal is to net \$100,000 in funds raised, remit \$30,000 to ZI and retain \$70,000. Committees identified include: Venue, Program/Entertainment, Logistics, Fundraising, Publicity, and Club History. Volunteers are needed and all are asked to participate. Tracking the progress of each committee will be visible in a Google shared document.

The broad discussion was regarding how the funds raised should be spent. Choosing this in advance will provide greater publicity opportunities as it should be a signature project associated with Zonta. Suggestions raised included Sojourners Summer Hope Camp, the Waukesha County Technical College new AI and STEM scholarship program and community advocacy for housing. Key points raised were ideas about leveraging existing/affiliated relationships that are well known, spending funds over several years for a long-term impact, and engaging other City authorities on what the need is.

100 Year lapel pins were given to members.

<u>Fundraising/Fashion Show</u> – Pam Knackert passed around the sign-up sheet for day-before and day-of activities. All members are asked to participate. Printed invitations were distributed. Note that when registering, the menu choice is to be made following payment. Karen Smith is collecting \$20 or bottles for the wine pull.

<u>Program</u> – Venues have been chosen for the Club meetings: Shorewood Library in September; VFW on Beloit Road in October and November; St. Camillus Community Room for December social.

<u>Z-Club</u> – Carol Mangold reported that a new coordinator will be chosen as Kate Gay has retired. Some of their members may attend our Club meeting in September and we would like to see a strong showing from Club members.

Strategic Planning Update: Carol Mangold solicited interest from any member(s) who would like to join the Board Meeting when this topic is discussed. As time was limited this evening, the Board will share its initial thoughts on planning at a future meeting.
