

Zonta/Neu-Life Joint Advocacy Program

A proposal is in the works for a sexual violence/trafficking prevention program to be jointly administered by Neu-Life and Zonta. We are planning staff education, preparation, and training as well as education for a pilot group of high schoolers. There will likely be opportunities for Zontians to be educated about trafficking and trained to be youth resources (ie.g. help run these programs).
