President's Message...


Greetings Milwaukee Zontians;

ARTREACH Pilot Program

We are piloting the ARTREACH program to educate youth about human sex trafficking. While the program is taking longer than expected, not unusual in ARTREACH rolllouts, we are convinced that the important messages have been communicated to Neu-Life youth based on their individual art works, and we are poised to begin the collaborative art pieces in early January. We expect that we will have three or four paintings with anti-human trafficking messages to showcase by the end of February.

We are aiming to have a reception/event(s) of some sort to **showcase the artwork and raise community consciousness** about the dangers of human trafficking for our Milwaukee youth. First steps will be within Neu-Life's African History Month (February) and a Zonta meeting TBD.

We will be putting together a committee to brainstorm ideas and work with Neu-Life to pull off an event or other community educational opportunities at malls, etc. Lynn Oehlke and Jackie Beaudry have expressed interest in brainstorming some ideas. Anyone else interested, please let us know, as we'll be setting up a meeting to get some ideas together. January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, so that offers some possibilities. Clear Channel is a likely partner.

News From the North

The "TLC Project" for the Family Crisis Center became the Service/Advocacy project to raise awareness of violence against women and kick off the "Zonta Says NO" campaign in Stevens Point. The women residing at River Point Oxford House helped assemble over 100 of these packets for the women at the shelter. Information about Zonta's mission and programs was shared with these women at the weekly house meeting and packets were assembled on November 22. The residents were excited to participate in a project to give back to the community, as they are grateful for being given the opportunity to reside at River Point. We will be repeating this project in April as part of Sexual Assault Awareness month.

Items for the packets were provided by Zonta Club of Milwaukee members, with some additional travel sized items being donated by other Zontians at fall convention, Family Crisis Center Advisory Board members and friends of River Point. A big thank-you to Zonta Club of Milwaukee members for your donations!

The TLC's were delivered to the shelter at the FCC Advisory Board meeting on November 25, the first day of the "Zonta Says NO" campaign.
