Topic: Creating a Sustained, Multi-faceted Approach to Violence Prevention

The Medical College of Wisconsin and the Medical College's Consortium on Public and Community Health committed \$8.2 Million over the next 5 years to implement the Youth Violence Prevention Initiative. Described as one of the most under-recognized major problem health problem in Wisconsin, this initiative will decrease rates of violence in identified areas of Milwaukee and possibly greater Wisconsin.

Ramon Candelaria, former Executive Director of the Latino Community Center, has been selected as the Director of Milwaukee's new Youth Violence Prevention Initiative. ZONTA members and guests are encouraged to attend our October 27 program. Mr. Candelaria will discuss the goals of YVPI, its expansive partnerships and its plans to implement violence prevention programs for youth, develop leadership capacity and strengthen our community capacity to prevent youth violence.

Presidents Message.....

Dear Sister Zontians:

On March 8, International Women's Day is celebrated in many countries around the world. It is a day when women are recognized for their achievements without regard to divisions, whether national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic or political. It is an occasion for looking back on past struggles and accomplishments, and more importantly, for looking ahead to the untapped potential and opportunities that await future generations of women.

In 1975, during International Women's Year, the United Nations began celebrating International Women's Day on 8 March. Two years later, in December 1977, the General Assembly adopted a resolution proclaiming a United Nations Day for Women's Rights and International Peace to be observed on any day of the year by Member States, in accordance with their historical and national traditions. In adopting its resolution, the General Assembly recognized the role of women in peace efforts and development and urged an end to discrimination and an increase of support for women's full and equal participation.

International Women's Day first emerged from the activities of labor movements at the turn of the twentieth century in North America and across Europe.

Since those early years, International Women's Day has assumed a new global dimension for women in developed and developing countries alike. The growing international women's movement, which has been strengthened by four global United Nations women's conferences, has helped make the commemoration a rallying point to build support for women's rights and participation in the political and economic arenas. Increasingly, International Women's Day is a time to reflect on progress made, to call for change and to celebrate acts of courage and determination by ordinary women who have played an extraordinary role in the history of their countries and communities. In addition, to celebrating International Women's Day, Zonta also celebrates Rose Day on March 8 of each year.

Zonta Rose Day was introduced at the 1984 Zonta International convention in Sydney, Australia. The Zonta symbol is the yellow rose, a reminder of the vital work Zonta does to advance the status of women locally and worldwide.

District 6 Service Committee Update

March! It's that lion or lamb time of year. It is also National Women's History Month. Originally, only March 8th was recognized as "Women's Day", which had its roots in the labor and feminist movement of the early 20th century. This day was variable celebrated throughout the 20th century but in 1975, the United Nations declared March 8th as International Women's Day. Many of our clubs have celebrations or events on that day but I'd like to consider the whole month of March as a time to celebrate women.

In 1978, the National Women's History Project was developed in northern California to address the fact that women's contributions to history were often ignored in school curriculums of the day. In 1980, President Carter declared the week of March 8th as National Women's History Week. With more and more states declaring the month of March as Women's History Month, Congress finally declared March as National Women's History Month in perpetuity in 1987.

Women's History Month is celebrated in a variety of fashions ranging from local government proclamations to organizations running essay contests for school children. As a result, schools are including more information on women's contribution to history, science and the arts in their curriculum and libraries offer more resources that include women and their impact on history.

What can we do?

Personally, we could give a book celebrating a woman's accomplishments to a young woman or man in our live (yes, young men need to know that woman have been important in history too). Buy a stamp commemorating a notable woman and use it to send a letter to a woman that is important in your life.

As a club, the service opportunities could include sponsoring an event such as an essay writing contest at a local school or library, buying resource material for that school or library, and/or creating a display of notable woman for the school or library. Check out the Library of Congress website for further ideas.

Maya Angelou noted: "How important it is for us to recognize and celebrate our heroes and she-roes". So find your "she-ro" and celebrate her accomplishments this month.


