## Presidents Message.....

Dear Zontians:

November is the month where we typically celebrate Thanksgiving but where did the tradition come from. Let's take a trip back in history to find out.

#### Thanksgiving's Ancient Origins

Although the American concept of Thanksgiving developed in the colonies of New England, its roots can be traced back to the other side of the Atlantic. Both the Separatists who came over on the Mayflower and the Puritans who arrived soon after brought with them a tradition of providential holidays—days of fasting during difficult or pivotal moments and days of feasting and celebration to thank God in times of plenty.

As an annual celebration of the harvest and its bounty, moreover, Thanksgiving falls under a category of festivals that spans cultures, continents and millennia. In ancient times, the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans feasted and paid tribute to their gods after the fall harvest. Thanksgiving also bears a resemblance to the ancient Jewish harvest festival of Sukkot. Finally, historians have noted that Native Americans had a rich tradition of commemorating the fall harvest with feasting and merrymaking long before Europeans set foot on their shores. As you can see, Thanksgiving celebrations, the act of giving thanks, are more global than we may think. How does this relate to Zonta? I'm glad you asked. Who gives us thanks as Zontians?:

- The women and girls in Haiti who are being empowered to ensure an increased capacity to provide services to victims of gender-based violence and support for women's economic livelihoods through the funding provided by Zonta.
- The women who receive Amelia Earhart
  Fellowships to continue to pursue their goals
  in the areas of aerospace related sciences and
  engineering
- The young women who receive the Jane M Klausman scholarship to continue reaching for their aspirations in the field of business
- The young women who receive the Young omen in Public Affairs award to continue their work in volunteerism and dedication to the advancement of the status of women
- The young women in our Z and Golden Z Clubs who are provided opportunities to gain valuable leadership skills through service and advocacy.

We as Zontians have a lot to be thankful for since we have an opportunity to benefit from the many thanks all around the world. I am thankful to a part of such a wonderful group of women who are dedicated to advancing the status of women in the Milwaukee area as well as worldwide. 

## Zonta Foundation— Action Required

The 2011 application for grant money for 2012 is now available. Any member who knows of an organization aligned with Zonta's goals that (s)he believes is possibly worthy of a grant from the Milwaukee Zonta Foundation, Inc., may forward an application directly to that organization (application attached), or request that the Foundation Board forward an application to that organization – forward request electronically to Donna Neal. We want to surface as many worthy applications as possible in these economically troubled times. In the past, grants have typically ranged from \$1000 to \$3000 annually over 1 to 3 years, though past actions are not necessarily predictive of future decisions. This year, the Foundation Board will give extra weight to applications that address issues facing girls or young women in Milwaukee, in line with the strategic direction of the club. The application due date is December 15.
