## September 24, 2014 6 p.m. Dinner/Meeting

#### Welcome, Introduction, and Dinner:

The meeting was called to order by President, Donna Kahl-Wilkerson, at 6 p.m. Jacqueline Beaudry gave the invocation.

#### President, Donna Kahl-Wilkerson welcomed our guests:

Guests included Ms. Gloria Jones, guest of Nell Kendrick; Maria Gehreselasse, mother of Helen Fetaw, one of our two recipients of the Women in Public Affairs Scholarship; and Marisol Ramos, winner of the Women in Science Scholarship award. Additionally announced were transferred member Gail Zalewski from Stevens Point, and new member Karen LeSage who will be installed later this evening as a new member of the Zonta Club of Milwaukee.

#### Program Chair, introduce guest speaker.

Andrea Ziel, Executive Director, of Women On Call, a nonprofit organization headquartered in Chicago, Illinois, that has created an on-line network to link women with professional skills to specific nonprofit organizations, matching skills to need. This informative presentation offered examples of the positive outcomes of these connections, and strategies to focus on what the volunteer can reasonable offer and what is really needed by the organization and then connecting the two. Most of the nonprofits have potential and are under the \$350,000 level. In the Milwaukee area, there will be a workshop on October 8th at Manpower from 8-10am for volunteers.

#### Jody Rhodes reported for Neu-Life:

- -The Back Packs program was a great success, and over 100 back packs filled with supplies were distributed. The children created huge thank you cards that were passed around at the meeting.
- -The Career Fair went very well with over 100 children in attendance. Pam Knackert and Donna Neal shared knowledge and skills on marketing, Cheryl Lucas-DeBerry on working together with toys and gadgets, and Donna Kahl-Wilkerson on strategies for interviewing for high school children.
- -The Art Reach Program will showcase the art work on human trafficking awareness. This collaboration with youth will be used to raise the level of awareness in the community. Volunteers are needed and welcome. Contact Donna Neal. This will be in December or January which is also the month of raising awareness of slavery and "Zonta Says No."
- -Girls On the Run 5K will be November 16, 2014. There are 10 girls involved in the event at this point. Running buddies are needed. It will be at the Bay Shore Town Center.
- -The Youth Harvest Feast: Farm to Fork fundraiser will be Saturday, October 25th, from 11am to 2pm. There are 20 spots for this quality, gourmet lunch with 10 places open at this point. There will be tours of the gardens.
- -The Neu Life Art Room Building Campaign is going well and as scheduled. A third of the \$600,000 has been achieved.

#### Joni Reese and Joann Comodore reported:

-The consensus was that the convention was successful, informative, and a very good venue for new Zontians to learn about the breadth and depth of the organization.

#### **Donna Conant, Governor:**

-Donna experienced the officers at the Convention to be a strong leadership team, who are focused on results, and address root causes of issues at the International level. International President, Maria Jose Landeira Oestergaard, is an engineer by education and trade, so brings expertise and structure. There was a long d iscussion of the bylaws, and Donna Conant presided over the parliamentary procedure microphone of the discussion. The bylaws are on the International Website. # Zonta Scholarship Team Update

At our September meeting, we had hoped to introduce three of our scholarship winners.

However, unforeseen circumstances (a death in the family and an acute illness) caused last-minute cancellations by two of our honorees.

On the bright side, our winner of the Zonta Women in Science Scholarship (Marisol Ramos) was with us, along with the Maria Gehreselasse, the mother of Helen Fetaw, one of the two winners of our Young Women in Public Affairs Scholarship, who we highlighted in last month's edition of this newsletter.

**Women in Science:** The winner of our 2014 Women in Science Scholarship was Marisol Ramos. She is now finishing up her senior year at Alverno College. Among the reasons that her application stood out was the combination of her academic achievement, intern work and service activities.

As a wife and mother of two, she has excelled academically, completed two internships at the Medical College of Wisconsin, and has generously volunteered her time both at her college and in the local community.

Among her accomplishments were being President of Pre-Professional Women of Alverno, and volunteering as a Student Peer Mentor for the Wisconsin Alliance for Minority participation at Alverno College.

Her numerous community service included volunteer efforts with Junior Achievement, Bruce Guadalupe Community School, Aurora Walker's Point Community Clinic, and the Medical College of Wisconsin.

**Women in Business:** Megan Fitzpatrick was awarded our 2014 Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship. Megan is now in her senior year, studying accounting as an honors student at University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Not only is she an excellent student, she has made a difference by founding a mentoring program for women in business at UWM. Her academic hopes are to complete her degree, pass the Certified Public Accountants (CPA) exam, study in Germany for a graduate class, and earn her Master in Accounting degree. Personally she hopes to continue to be a mentor and inspire other women.

**Women in Technical Specialties:** Monica Crosby is the recipient of this year's award. This Zonta scholarship was designed to encourage and support need-based students in the pursuit of their academic and career goals. And based on Monica's application, she truly is a stellar example of the kind of person that Zonta members like to encourage.

Although Monica grew up in a loving two-parent nuclear family, she experienced the many challenges of growing up poor and living in the inner city. Furthermore, she was challenged with physical ailments. Yet she was able to successfully work for McDonalds for 15 years.

Then, her husband encouraged her to pursue her dream of becoming an Information Technology (IT) professional with the FBI.

Although she graduated from high school with only a 1.9 GPA, she was able to earn an amazing 3.6 GPA for her Associate in Applied Science Degree in IT Networking at Milwaukee Area Technical College. She is now working on her Bachelor's Degree at UWM...while being a role model encouraging her own daughters to "reach for the stars".

# Meet Our Member Diane Lindsley



I was born in the Bronx, NY on the hottest summer day in 1947, a fact my mother retold on my birthday every year. When I was 7, we moved to Yonkers, NY, a few miles north, and I continued to attend public schools. [They were excellent back in the day.] For fun in high school, I did genetic research at Boyce Thompson Institute for Plant Research, winning the senior prize in chemistry at the Westchester County Science Fair. I suppose that would classify me as a "geek" today.

College found me commuting to City College of NY in Manhattan where I majored in Botany. In 1969, I was accepted at UWM for my Master's in Plant Ecology and continued on for my PhD in 1977. Needing a full time job, I began working for the Milwaukee County Dept. of Parks as their Greenhouse Technician. I remained with Parks, becoming a Floriculturist in the Arid Dome of Mitchell Park Horticultural Conservatory, then Assistant Conservatory Director, and finally as Parks' Horticultural Director, overseeing the Conservatory, Boerner Botanical Gardens, Wehr Nature Center and the Greenhouse Center. I retired in 2002 but continue to volunteer at the facilities from time to time as needed.

My life in Zonta actually began at the Conservatory when I encountered Zontian Doris Haldiman who became the first president of Friends of the Domes. She was persistent and I joined the Club in January 1987. In all my days in school and in Parks, I had never worked with so many women at one time and it has been delightful. What I learned at work, I applied in Zonta and what I learned in Zonta, I applied at work. I've been the Club President, District 6 Secretary, District 6 Advocacy Chair, Club Foundation Treasurer, and ZI's North American Advocacy Representative.

Currently, I work with Pam Knackert on club history, club bylaw changes (still a geek), the Fashion Show Committee, and am Club Treasurer. I also represent the Club on the Policy Subcommittee of the Human Trafficking Task Force of Greater Milwaukee and on the committee producing the annual International Women's Day Celebration in Milwaukee. I am also a member of the Women's International League for Peace & Freedom and will be working with them and Zonta on a project called Cities for CEDAW.

My hobbies include genealogy, gardening, travel and photography.

# Meet Our Member Victoria Frazier



Born in New Orleans, Louisiana, Victoria Frazier has been in Milwaukee over 30 years. She attended Southern University in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Secondary Education. She also holds a Master's in History from Prairie View A&M University in Prairie View, Texas. She continued her studies in Milwaukee at Cardinal Stritch University in Educational Leadership.

Victoria has been married for 43 years and is the mother of one son. As a retired Army officer's wife, Victoria has travelled extensively, lived and taught in several states within the continental United States and abroad. She lived and taught in Germany for three years. Victoria retired from Milwaukee Public Schools in 2012 after 28 years of service to the children of Milwaukee and mentoring teachers and administrators in the system.
