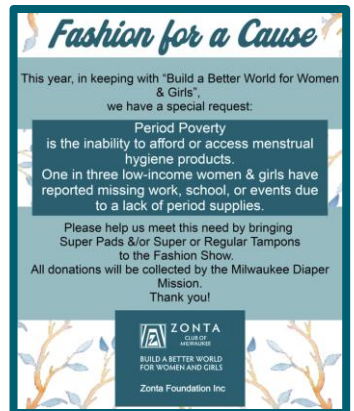
Service

Membership

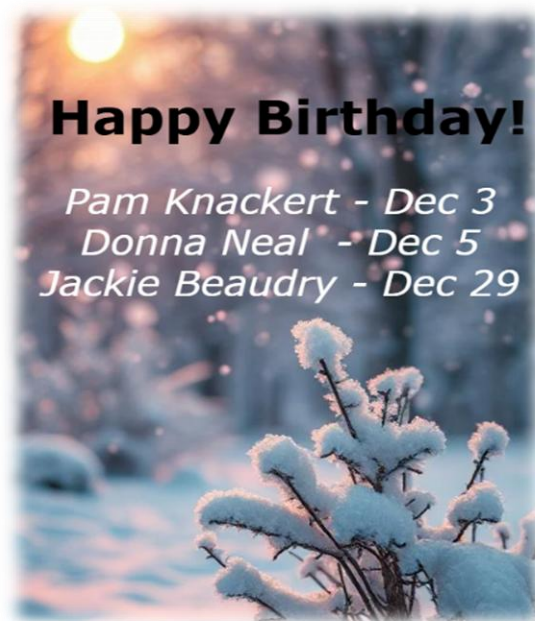

Advocacy

Wisconsin Zonta Lobby Day November 18, 2025

Submitted by Cathy Myers, with participation from WI Clubs, including Milwaukee representatives:

On November 18th Janesville members participated in a Lobby Day at the capital to talk to legislators about ending child marriage and supporting the WI ERA. Participating as well were the EClub, Milwaukee, and Madison clubs.

We secured thirty appointments and had very productive conversations with either legislators or their staff. It was a session day, so meeting with the legislator was not always possible. The Child Marriage Bill, AB656, SB634, received a couple more co-sponsors after our lobby day.

If we did not have an appointment, we dropped by their office and had a quick chat with staff members. We left behind materials on both the Child Marriage Bill and the WI ERA for all, and a little pillow with small wedding rings tied to it with lace and a business card tucked into the back that had a QR code with more information about the child marriage issue. We made 132 contacts in all.

Our state is politically very divided, and few, if any, representatives are willing to work across the aisle. So far, despite receiving a lot of positive responses on the bill to end Child Marriage, no Republicans have co-sponsored. Additionally, the ERA Joint Resolution appears to have no support from Republican members.

During our debrief, we discussed which Republicans may be persuadable and who may be willing to serve as a "champion" for children. We are still working on a follow-up plan. We are thinking of using social media to target people who live in the districts of persuadable Republicans and asking them to call their representatives' offices in support. We also have friends who live in those areas and who can like/share those posts and call the representative on behalf of the bill.



2025: 16 Days of Activism

Gender-based violence is one of the most pervasive and yet least-recognized human rights abuses in the world.

Unknown

How does one become an effective activist and stop gender-based violence?

- ✦ By realizing that some changes can take years. Big change does not happen overnight but is the culmination of many small efforts over time. Do not become discouraged!
- ✦ By educating yourself about gender-based violence issues. If you don't understand the causes you want to focus on, your efforts are more likely to fall flat or even cause more harm than good.
- ✦ By partnering with others. Groups can share resources, attract more media coverage, and draw more supporters. Groups can also provide you with experience and effective plans to overcome hurdles.
- ✦ By raising awareness. Be prepared to discuss gender-based violence with others. Many people don't even recognize all the types of injustices. Raise your voice on your social media platform.
- ✦ By getting involved in political processes. That includes voting for officials and policies, both local and national. Know who are your local, state, and national elected officials are and don't be afraid to contact them about issues and pending legislation.

Being an activist means being passionate about an issue, being committed to change, and being determined even if change takes a long time to realize.

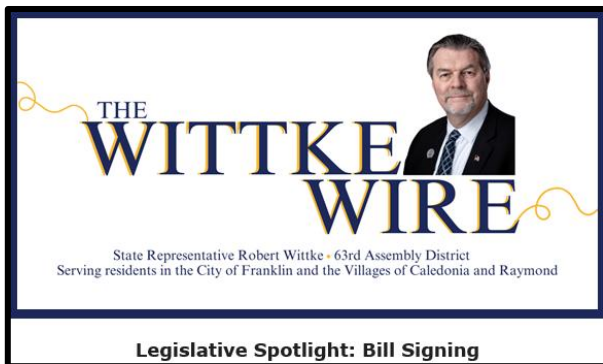

See the attached, with info on the signing of **Assembly Bill 265**, authored by Rep Robert Wittke. This week, I was pleased to join Governor Evers as he signed **Assembly Bill 265**, which I authored. The bill, now [WI Act 56](#), was inspired by the work of Racine Investigator Luke Johnson, who also joined us for the bill signing. WI Act 56 delivers meaningful and long-overdue updates to Wisconsin's statute of limitation laws on human trafficking and child sexual exploitation, marking an important step forward in protecting survivors and holding offenders accountable.

Human trafficking is not a far-away problem — it's happening far too often in Southeastern Wisconsin. Recently, I was invited to speak at the launch of the **HEMAD** campaign, where **I discussed AB 265/WI Act 56**. Breaking the business model of trafficking by eliminating the demand is the mission of HEMAD, a 21-year-old faith-based nonprofit initiative of the [Convergence Resource Center](#) in Milwaukee and Madison. Their work engages men directly in the responsibility to end trafficking and protect vulnerable individuals in our communities. Traffickers destroy lives, and victims deserve more than delayed or uncertain justice — they deserve meaningful, certain, and lasting justice, which WI Act 56 helps law enforcement deliver. 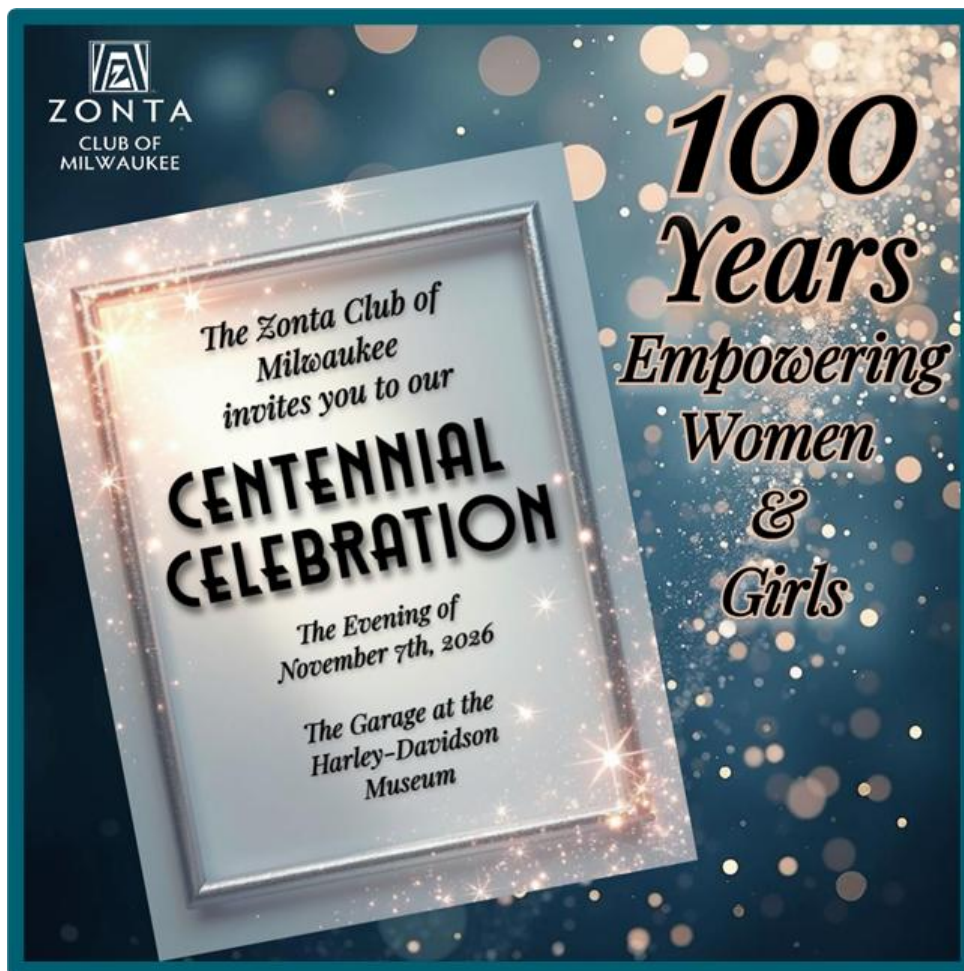
Centennial Event Update

Kids Matter Inc.

Students have identified Kids Matter Inc. as the organization with which they will partner this year. Kids Matter is a non-profit that supports child victims of neglect and abuse. They will:

A. Organize Hope Packages

- They are doing a bake sale 12/9 and 12/10 to raise funds to purchase items for the packages as needed.
- They will organize a drive in Jan to collect items for the Hope Packages. List of specific items needed by teens will be provided by Kids Matter.
- Packages will be assembled at one of the Z club's meetings (dates for second semester meetings are TBD)

B. Teens that are part of Kids Matter will come in during one of Z club's meetings to speak with the club about their firsthand experiences.

Zonta Club and Leadership School Assembly

Z Club has requested one of the slots reserved for all school student assemblies. The Z Club is hoping that members of Zonta Club of MKE will come in to present to the student body on leadership and their work within the community. The goal is to raise awareness and interest in the club.
